原文：第1段：The wildfires themselves, experts say, are generally hotter, faster, and spread more erratically than in the past.

题目: 20. It is important for people to actively notice when good things happen.

原文: D 段: Suzanne Segerstrom, professor of psychology at the University of Kentucky, believes that the key to increasing optimism is through cultivating optimistic behavior, rather than positive thinking. She recommends you train yourself to pay attention to good fortune by writing down three positive things that come about each day. This will help you convince yourself that favourable outcomes actually happen all the time, making it easier to begin taking action.

题目：21. Courage can be learned once its origins in a sense of responsibility are understood.

原文：H 段：According to Cynthia Pury, a psychologist at Clemson University, Pedeleose's story proves the point that courage is not motivated by fearlessness, but by moral obligation. Pury also believes that people can acquire courage.
解析：根据 courage 回到原文定位到文章 H 段。题目中 learned=原文中 acquire; 原文中 a sense of responsibility=原文中 moral obligation。

题目：22. It is possible to overcome shyness when faced with the need to speak in public.

题目：24. an account of how someone overcame a sad experience

原文：C 段：David Fajgenbaum had to make a similar transition. He was preparing for university, when he has <u>an accident</u> that put an end to his sports career. On campus, he quickly found that beyond ordinary counselling, the university had no services for students who were <u>undergoing physical rehabilitation</u> and <u>suffering from depression</u> like him. He therefore launched a support group to help others in similar situation. He took action despite his own pain - a typical response



of an optimist.

原文：G 段：When he got back, he switched.... He also vowed to look for the joy in everything, including failure, as this could help him learn about his research and himself. <u>One thing that can hold joy back is a person's concentration on avoiding failure rather than their looking forward to doing something well. 'Focusing on being safe might get in the way of your reaching your goals,'</u> explains Kashdan, for example, are you hoping to get through a business lunch without embarrassing yourself, or are you thinking about how fascinating the conversation might be?

The new manager was intimidating staff so Pedeleose carefully recorded each instance of bullying and eventually took the evidence to a senior director, knowing his own job security would be threatened. Eventually the manager was the one to go.

原文：第 4 段：If Dollo's law is right, atavisms should occur only very rarely, if at all. Yet almost since the idea took root, exceptions have been cropping up. In 1919, for example, a humpback whale with a pair of leg-like appendages over a metre long, complete with a full set of limb bones, was caught off Vancouver Island in Canada. Explorer Roy Chapman Andrew argued at the time that the whale must be a throwback to a land-living ancestor.
