五十大习语



在英语中,有这么一种词汇表达,叫做习语。乍眼一看,很难理解这些表达的意思。如: a walk in the park。在公园里走路???是什么鬼???这其实是"简单"的意思。我们可 以讲: Cooking is a walk in the park to me.再如: in the pink。在粉色中???这个表达的意 思是"身体健康"。其实,我们中文也会说:"你看你这小脸儿,红扑扑儿、粉嫩嫩的。"

习语就好像我们中文的成语一样,在一个人说话自然流畅的前提下,偶尔使用一两个, 会给人一种此人用词非常地道、语言水平很高的感觉。在本小节中,我们学习五十个(组) 在雅思口语考试中非常实用、非常加分的习语。

1. take a load off 放松

e.g. It's extremely important to take a load off once in a while by going hiking or picnicking.

once in a while 偶尔、有时

2. a walk in the park=a cakewalk 非常简单的事

e.g. I thought drawing was a cakewalk when I was a kid, but now I just feel that I can't draw at all.

3. no picnic 很难

e.g. Painting is no picnic to me. I can never do it well.

4. once in a blue moon 很少、千载难逢

e.g. I take the bus once in a blue moon coz buses are never on time.

5. on cloud nine=as happy as a clam 超级开心的

e.g. When my dad told me that he would take me to Disneyland, I was on cloud nine/happy as a clam.

6. have a blast=have a ball=have a whale of a time 玩的开心

e.g. I threw a party at home last Sunday and had a blast/had a ball/had a whale of a time.

7. be caught up in a traffic jam 堵在路上

e.g. I'm always caught up in a traffic jam on my way to work.

8. like a cattle car 非常拥挤(像牲畜车一样)

e.g. The subway in Beijing is just like a cattle car, but I still have to take it every day.

9. get out of the rat race 逃离大城市的疯狂竞争

e.g. It's really stressful(给人很大压力的) living in a large city, so I want to move to a smaller city to get out of the rat race.

stressful 给人很大压力的

10. chew the fat 闲谈

e.g. I often chew the fat with my parents during and after dinner.

11. hit the sack 上床睡觉

e.g. I like to do some reading before hitting the sack, which helps me fall asleep faster.

12. on the same wavelength 志趣相投、观点一致

e.g. My parents and I are on the same wavelength, so we find it quite enjoyable talking with each other about different things.

13. see eye to eye 观点一致

e.g. He and I see eye to eye on almost everything.

14. I'm my mother/father all over again 我很像我的妈妈/爸爸

e.g. My relatives always say that I'm my mother all over again. We're both outgoing and optimistic.

15. a chip off the old block 很像妈妈/爸爸

e.g. I think I'm a chip off the old block. My dad and I are equally shy.

16. ... runs in the family 我的家里人都有...

e.g. My dad is a hard-working man. I think it runs in the family coz I also consider diligence to be a very important quality.

17. quality time 美好惬意的时光(和亲近的人在一起)

e.g. My parents and I are very close and we always spend a lot of quality time together.

18. work like a beaver 工作很忙 as busy as a beaver 非常忙

e.g. I've been working like a beaver lately and I really need a vacation.

19. be swamped with my work/studies 疲于应对、不堪承受

e.g. I'm in my third year of university and I'm so swamped with my studies.

20. as healthy as a horse 非常健康

e.g. I do outdoor activities on a regular basis. This is why I'm as healthy as a horse.

21. in the pink 健康红润、精神很好

e.g. I have to work out more often in order for me to always be in the pink.

work out 健身

22. have two left feet 手脚不灵活

e.g. I have two left feet, so I don't do any sport well.



23. under the weather 身体有点不舒服

e.g. I'm feeling under the weather today, so I'm sorry if I don't seem to be very enthusiastic about our conversation.

24. have a sweet tooth 喜欢吃甜食

e.g. I have a sweet tooth and so I always eat some chocolate, dark chocolate particularly.

25. get rid of my love handles 减掉腰间赘肉

e.g. I don't suppose I can get rid of my love handles if I keep eating a lot of chocolate.

26. all the rage 非常流行

e.g. Giving chocolate as a gift is all the rage in China.

27. twists and turns 跌宕起伏

e.g. The plot of this novel is so unpredictable, I mean, there are so many twists and turns.

plot 情节 unpredictable 无法预测的

28. can't put it down 好看到停不下来

e.g. I came across a good biography last week. It's so gripping that I just can't put it down.

come across 偶然遇到、偶然发现 gripping 非常有吸引力的

29. bumper-to-bumper 超级拥堵的

e.g. We always get bumper-to-bumper traffic, so I only take the subway.

30. fender-benders 小交通事故

e.g. I really hate it when I take a taxi and there are some fender-benders on the road.

31. step on it 快点开

e.g. Bus drivers tend to drive very slowly and I always want to tell them to step on it.

32. jam-packed 超级拥挤的

e.g. Buses tend to be jam-packed, so I hardly ever take them.

33. a mine of information

e.g. The internet is a mine of information and I've learned a great many things from it.

34. be up to speed on sth 了解...的最新消息

e.g. I like to read news online and it allows me to be up to speed on what's going on in the world.



what's going on 发生了什么

35. spoil oneself (by doing sth) 犒劳某人、(通过...)来变得开心

e.g. After a hard day at work, I often spoil myself by playing a few games on my computer.

36. a household name 一个家喻户晓的名字

e.g. My favorite singer is Eason, a household name in China.

37. have a musical ear 擅长音乐

e.g. I don't really have a musical ear, so whenever I sing, people tell me to stop.

38. have a tin ear 不擅长音乐

e.g. I have a tin ear, so I seldom sing.

39. drive me up the wall 令我很不爽、令我很烦

e.g. My neighbors threw a party at night and it was so loud. It drove me up the wall.

40. push my buttons 令我很生气

e.g. No matter what I said, my girlfriend wouldn't respond to me and that just pushed my buttons.

41. blow my top 发脾气

e.g. I blew my top yesterday because my neighbors kept making noise at night.

42. a pain in the neck 令人很烦的人/东西/事

e.g. There's a construction site near my home and that's a real pain in the neck.

43. a trip down memory lane 回顾往事

e.g. I love photography because looking at old photos is a trip down memory lane.

44. take my breath away (美到)令人窒息

e.g. The beauty of that place took my breath away and I took hundreds of photos there.

45. a walking encyclopedia 一个无所不知的人

e.g. My dad reads newspapers every day and he's a walking encyclopedia.

46. not stand on ceremony 不拘礼 make oneself at home 像在自己家一样

e.g. When people visit me, I hope that they don't stand on ceremony and make themselves at home.

47. it's the thought that counts 心意最重要

e.g. I'm happy as long as I get gifts, whether they're expensive or not. It's the thought that counts.

48. gear up for sth

e.g. In order to gear up for this speaking test, I went to an English corner every week.

49. pick one's brains 向某人请教/讨教

e.g. I enjoy hanging out with my grandpa because I can always pick his brains on some issues.

50. cost an arm and a leg 非常昂贵

e.g. That piano I bought cost me an arm and a leg. Honestly, I really regret buying it.
