# 3. 信息搜索

I was trying to write a paper about **confirmation bias**<sup>15</sup>, which is a **phenomenon** discussed in social psychology. Even though it was an **introductory** psychology course, I had to put a **lot** of effort into it.

Honestly, I wasn't really prepared for how long the research process would take<sup>16</sup>. I used the university's library database to filter through<sup>17</sup> hundreds of articles. I also went to the library in person so I could look at different scientific journals. Then, once I found about a dozen sources, I had to read through each of them to find relevant points to support my paper. It took about one week from start to finish<sup>18</sup>.

I **didn't** exactly love looking for the information. Although it was **exciting** to develop my **skills** as a student, it was also **tedious** to **look through** all those sources. Research can be a very **long** and **frustrating** process, depending on what you're looking for.

However, the research was definitely **worth** all the work. I was able to write a **strong** paper<sup>19</sup> and receive a **good** grade. So I'm **glad** I took my time with researching<sup>20</sup>.

She gave me **extra practice** in between lessons<sup>32</sup>. It turns out the old saying is true; **practice** does make **perfect**<sup>33</sup>. They were **simple** songs, not advanced at all, but I still felt a sense of **satisfaction** for having **conquered** my doubts<sup>34</sup> and learned something **new**. There was some **metal** waste and **food** waste as well, but the majority of the litter was **plastic products**.

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Most of the plastic waste was actually in the **creek** that runs through the marsh<sup>42</sup>, so we had to use large **nets** to scoop it out<sup>43</sup>. It took a **pretty long** time and it was a **difficult** task, but everyone was determined to do a **good** job. Since many schools often take students to that marsh for **science** lessons and **outdoor** education, we wanted it to be a **nice**, **clean** area. We especially didn't want the kids to **come** across<sup>44</sup> anything **dangerous** or **toxic** in the marsh, so the clean-up effort was **necessary**. It also gave us an opportunity to learn **more** about the **value** of community service.

I felt quite **disappointed** about seeing this **large** amount of plastic waste. Littering is **illegal** in my country, so I was **surprised** that this public marsh was still **so messy**<sup>45</sup>. Plus, I think that there are still **too many** plastic products being used, and I wish that more companies offered **alternatives** in **reusable** materials. That way there would be **much less** plastic waste, which is better for the **community** and the **environment**.
