They need to reinforce that other people, especially teachers and other authority figures⁹, need to be respected. Children should learn that directly from their parents.

4. What disagreements do parents and children usually have?

It seems to me that parents and children usually <u>disagree over things like¹⁰</u> responsibilities and schedules. For example, a parent might tell their child that they have to do a certain number of chores every week. Their child may not like having to do chores, so they'll disagree about their responsibilities. Or a parent might <u>impose a curfew</u>¹¹, which means the child can't stay out past a certain time. 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Topic 2 一节喜欢的英语课(印象深刻的英语课)

1. Why do people learn foreign languages? What are the benefits?

There are many benefits to learning a foreign language, and even more benefits to learning multiple foreign languages. Learning another language <u>improves your brain elasticity</u>¹², and it helps you communicate with other people and cultures. Learning a new language <u>forces your brain to create new pathways</u>¹³, which increases your intelligence as well as your memory skills. 2. What skills should foreign language teachers have?

Foreign language teachers should be encouraging, patient, and <u>eloquent</u>¹⁵. They need to be able to help when students become discouraged or unmotivated, since learning a language can be a frustrating task. They should also be patient since it takes a very long time to fully master a foreign language. Finally, they should be eloquent and <u>have a strong command of vocabulary in both languages</u>, so that they can explain complex ideas <u>in a comprehensible way</u>.

Topic 4 校外学到的重要东西

1. What can children learn from parents?

Children can learn lots of things from their parents. For one, they often <u>develop their morals and beliefs</u> <u>based on what their parents think</u>²³. For example, some parents give their children an allowance and teach them how to save their money. That's the first step in <u>developing financial literacy</u>²⁵. 3. Is it necessary for adults to learn new things?

Yes, it's necessary for adults to learn new things. On the one hand, adults are very <u>settled in life²⁹</u> and don't often feel the need to learn new things. Sometimes they don't have a lot of time to focus on things beyond their daily routine. However, I think that learning new things is important because it pushes adults to keep improving and <u>expanding their horizons</u>. It can also become a fun social activity for adults to learn new skills. If they never learn new things, they might get stuck in a rut³⁰. That leads to dissatisfaction.

4. How can people learn new things?

People can learn new things in a variety of ways; they can take a class, <u>talk to other people with more expertise</u>³¹, or do research on their own. Most people will try to <u>sign up for a class</u>³² in order to help them learn a new skill, or communicate with someone else in the same field. This way, they can learn from someone who is an expert. If there is no class available, then often you can find <u>tutorials</u>³³ or explanations online to help you learn a skill.

We can help reduce our use of plastic by <u>avoiding single-use plastics</u> like drinking straws or <u>plastic cutlery</u> ⁵⁶, which you use once and then throw away. We can also avoid using plastic bags, since those get discarded as well. Instead, we should use reusable cutlery made out of <u>sustainable materials</u> ⁵⁷. We can also buy canvas grocery bags that can be used multiple times. It's helpful to <u>buy grocery items in bulk</u> ⁵⁸ to reduce how much food packaging we buy and then throw out.

After all, things like washing your face and brushing your teeth are things most people do daily without even thinking about it. Routines for keeping the home tidy, and for completing chores such as cooking and laundry are also common. Anyway, <u>it makes sense to follow</u> routines daily in order to be efficient.

2. Should children have learning routines?

Yes, I think it's super important for children to establish certain learning routines. You know, most children aren't as disciplined as adults. So keeping some learning routines is helpful for them to have a better transition from playing to studying as well as to be more focused during their learning time. For example, teachers and parents should teach children how to make study plans and learning goals. And they should do that before they study. It's a very useful technique for children to have a clear idea of 284 what they're going to learn.

3. Does having routines at home make everyday life easier?

As long as the routine is a healthy one, then yes, having routines means that you are organized, efficient, and making the most of your time²⁸⁵. It also means that you can save brain space for more important matters²⁸⁶ than deciding what to do every minute of the day. If you look at the advice from the world's most successful people, you'll notice that they all stress the importance of routines.

4. What are the advantages of children having a daily routine at school? / Does having a routine make kids feel more secure at school?

I suppose that when children have a daily routine at school, they're able to have a sense of order in their life²⁸⁷. You know, the world can be a pretty chaotic²⁸⁸ place to live in. So when children know what to expect because of their routine, it helps them be able to manage whatever other stress they might be dealing with. Plus, it teaches them how to organize their time later on. Having a routine demonstrated for them can teach them some time management skills.

7. What are the differences between people's daily routines now and in the last 15 years?

It seems to me that over the last fifteen years, people's daily routines were more active and involved others. For example, people might go to work, have lunch with their coworkers, and then do something interesting with friends or family at the end of the day. But nowadays, ever since the COVID-19 pandemic²⁹⁵, it's more common for people to be isolated. They might work from home, which means they don't interact with others in real life. And instead of going out and seeing people, they might just stay home and keep to themselves²⁹⁶.

I think it's because the entertainment industry is more developed, and pop culture is changing as well. 20 years ago, bars and night clubs <u>weren't a thing in China³⁰¹</u>. But today, it's quite normal for young people to hang out with their friends at those places. And there are more popular outdoor activities as well, like camping, <u>scuba diving³⁰²</u>, sailing and so on. You rarely hear about people doing those activities 20 years ago but now they are <u>trendy things</u> among young people.

4. Can most people balance work and life in China?

Well, <u>it's hard to say</u>. I suppose that a good number of people can balance work and life in China. There are lots of people who <u>have a lot on their plate at both work and home³⁰³</u>. But they find a way to <u>evenly divide</u> their energy between the two. However, I think that as workplaces become more demanding and fast-paced, it gets harder to keep that work-life balance. People often have to <u>work themselves to the bone just to stay on track³⁰⁴</u>. So it's definitely difficult to keep that balance.

Yes, advertising definitely encourages us to buy things we don't need. Ads are designed to catch our attention³⁵² and make us feel a desire for a product we might not have even known about before. 1. In what situations would people be willing to get to know new people?
