Parents' habits, including dressing, eating, behaving, and so on, will influence their children, so it is important for parents to be good role models for their children and to give them a sense of how to behave in a normative ˈnɔ:meɪtv/ way.

3. Is it necessary for adults to learn new things?

Parents who are constantly learning new things can teach their children better. In today's society, it is only through continuous learning that we can better adapt to society and guide our children to become better.

Secondly, the constant exposure to new things can enrich parents' perspectives and change some of their old ideas, which can help reduce the generation gap between parents and children.

4. How can people learn new things?

There are many ways to learn new things, and reading is the easiest one in my opinion. Reading is an effective way to translate other people's experiences into our own, and we can read a lot to improve our knowledge and acquire various skills from books. Secondly,

due to the constant development of technology, social media such as TikTok is very popular in today's society and people can learn all kinds of knowledge in areas they are not familiar with through videos on these apps.
