So, when I saw this topic, the first person that <u>pops up in my mind(映入脑</u> 海) is my aunt. She's a true <u>business genius(商业奇才)</u>.

She has a very <u>intriguing/ interesting journey(有趣的历程)</u> in <u>the business</u> world(商业世界). <u>In a nutshell(长话短说,简而言之)</u>, initially(最初), she

worked as a nurse in a local hospital in her city, which is a small city in China. But she wasn't really happy with her job and life. She always <u>had a</u> <u>fascination with(有一种痴迷)</u> the business world. Her <u>entrepreneurial</u> <u>spirit(创业者精神)</u> was already <u>budding</u>(发芽) when she was working at the hospital. Finally, at the age of 30, she <u>made a bold decision(做出了大胆</u> <u>的决定)</u> to leave her <u>nursing career</u> and <u>dive into the world of</u> <u>entrepreneurship(进入创业的世界)</u>. That's when she opened her first bar with her husband, and they called it "The Walnut 胡桃里." Today they have 3 bars.

My aunt is a very <u>innovative(有创新能力的)</u> businessperson. She knows how to <u>think outside the box(发散思维)</u>. In a small city in China where people go to bars only to drink and have some <u>basic-level snack food(普</u> <u>通的零食小吃)</u>, my aunt <u>introduced live bands</u>, BBQ, <u>cocktail show</u>, and hosted a variety of fun performances and activities at her bar(我的姨妈引 进了现场乐队,烤肉,鸡尾酒表演和组织各种表演活动).

Her creativity <u>paid off</u> soon (很快就有了回报). "The walnut" quickly became <u>a local sensation (火了)</u>. It turned into a place where people not only enjoyed fantastic drinks and food, but also <u>experienced unique</u> <u>entertainment</u>. The atmosphere there was <u>unparallel/ matchless(无敌</u> 的).

<u>Moving on to</u> what attributed to her success. First, her <u>courage</u> to <u>step</u> <u>out of her comfort zone(走出舒适区)</u> and <u>pursue her passion(追寻梦想和激</u> <u>情)</u> for business was inspiring. Her <u>vision and determination(视野和决心)</u> <u>made it a reality</u>. And then, her <u>innovative ideas</u> really made her bar <u>stand</u> <u>out from the competition(鹤立鸡群)</u>. Like I said, she's a genius, a <u>born</u> <u>entrepreneur(天生的创业者)</u>.

#### Part3:

1. What factors lead to success?

Well, take my aunt for instance. To achieve success, you really need a lot of courage to <u>step out of your comfort zone</u>(走出舒适区) because <u>the</u> <u>road to success</u> is <u>rarely a smooth one (通往成功的道路往往都不平坦)</u>. You have to be willing to <u>endure hardships</u>(忍受困难) and <u>make sacrifices (选</u> <u>择牺牲)</u> <u>along the way.</u> Moreover, <u>having a clear vision</u> and <u>innovative</u> <u>ideas that set you apart from the crowd</u>(让你和其他人区别开) is crucial. <u>Thinking outside the box</u> can make a big difference. <u>But it doesn't stop</u> <u>there</u>(也不是到这儿就没了). <u>Hard work and dedication</u> are <u>a must</u>(一定要有 <u>努力工作和付出)</u>. Perseverance is key; you can't give up when <u>things get</u> <u>tough</u>(不能在情况不好的时候放弃). <u>Lastly, there's also the element of luck</u> <u>(还有幸运的成分)</u>, which is often <u>beyond your control/ out of your hand</u> <u>(不在你的控制范围)</u>. You don't get to choose it, but let's face it, sometimes <u>a stroke of luck</u>(一点点幸运) can boost you <u>to the next level of success</u> (让成功更上一层楼). (并列罗列)

2. What do people need to sacrifice for success?

Time, that's <u>the first thing comes to mind</u>(第一个想到的). Time with your family, time with your friends, time for leisure activities, etc. When you <u>work long hours(工作小时长)</u> chasing success, chances are you will sacrifice your time with people you love and things you enjoy doing. And then, you would sacrifice <u>the sense of stability</u>(稳定杆), <u>financial stability</u> <u>(经济稳定)</u> or <u>personal stability(个人稳定)</u>. You wouldn't have a <u>nine-tofive job(朝九晚五的工作)</u> and feeling perfectly comfortable <u>in your</u> <u>comfort zone</u>, instead, you will be <u>taking risks(冒险)</u> and feeling stressed out. What's more, sleep, rest or even health. When you work long hours,

you don't get to rest and sleep as much as you want, and that can <u>take a</u> <u>toll on(付出代价)</u> your mental and physical health. (罗列)

3. Which is more likely to be successful, family businesses or large corporations?

It's really hard to say as both family businesses and large corporations have their own <u>pros and cons</u>(优缺点). Family businesses always have <u>a</u> <u>personal touch</u>(个人风格) and can <u>provide personalized service</u> which can <u>foster customers' loyalty</u>(培养顾客忠诚度). And on the other hand, large corporations have more resources and access to a bigger market; they normally have more employees, therefore, more people more ideas. It's hard to generalize. (分头讨论)

4. Is it easy for a business to be successful without affecting the environment?

Well, running a business while being eco-friendly can be really challenging (会很有挑战). I think it's almost impossible to find a business which is <u>thriving (成功绽放)</u> and at the same time not <u>causing any burden</u> to the environment (不给环境带来任何负担). However, many successful businesses nowadays are finding ways to <u>reduce their environmental</u> footprint (减少给环境带来的负担) by using sustainable strategies and making eco-friendly products (制作对环境友好的产品). Actually, some customers are really <u>supporting/rooting for (支持)</u> the idea of buying eco-friendly products, and it can even become a <u>selling point (卖点)</u> for some businesses. (转折)

5. Can you provide some examples of family businesses in your country? Well, there are numerous <u>business giants(商业巨头)</u> that have their origins in family businesses. For instance, <u>Wanda Group(万达集团)</u>, a <u>highly successful business</u> with interests in real estate, entertainment, and tourism(在房地产、娱乐和旅游业都相当成功的企业). Another example is

the Wahaha Group(娃哈哈), it's super famous and successful in China's <u>food and beverage industry(餐饮行业)</u>. Personally, I have fond memories of growing up while enjoying their beverages. And then, there's the Midea Group(美的), a <u>leading manufacturer(领衔制造商)</u> of <u>home appliances</u> <u>(家用电器)</u>. In my home, all our essential appliances, such as the washing machine, electric fan, and kitchen appliances are all from this brand.(举 例子)

6. What qualities should be considered when recruiting employees?

First of all, of course, skills and experience are <u>a must(一定要有)</u> as you want somebody who can do the job right and do the job well. <u>On top of that</u>, attitude also is the key here. If a person is really <u>eager to learn(渴望</u> 学习), to adapt, to a grow in a company, this person can have a bright future. And then communication skills. A person who can <u>actively listen</u> and <u>express their feelings and ideas clearly</u> is really <u>golden(难得)</u>.(罗 列)
