2. How can we stop an argument from escalating into a fight?

I suppose that you have to try to keep calm. So you shouldn't raise your voice or <u>say anything mean-spirited</u>³. You need to remain cool and <u>collected</u>. You can't <u>blow your temper</u>⁴, even if the other person is really frustrating you. Sometimes it can be helpful to <u>take some space</u>⁵. If it's turning into a long, <u>drawn-out</u>⁶ disagreement, you should take a break and revisit the topic later when both of you are <u>less worked up</u>. That way, you can avoid getting too upset.

3. Who do you think should teach children to respect their teacher?

I think that parents should teach their children to respect their teachers. Children need to learn how to show respect from the very start, which is where parents come in⁷. As the people who have the most influence over them, and who spend the most time with them, parents have to set a good example⁸. They need to reinforce that other people, especially teachers and other authority figures⁹, need to be respected. Children should learn that directly from their parents.

4. What disagreements do parents and children usually have?

It seems to me that parents and children usually <u>disagree over things like¹⁰</u> responsibilities and schedules. For example, a parent might tell their child that they have to do a certain number of chores every week. Their child may not like having to do chores, so they'll disagree about their responsibilities. Or a parent might <u>impose a curfew</u>¹¹, which means the child can't stay out past a certain time. However, I think that learning new things is important because it pushes adults to keep improving and <u>expanding their horizons</u>. People can learn new things in a variety of ways; they can take a class, <u>talk to other people with more expertise</u>³¹, or do research on their own. Most people will try to <u>sign up for a class</u>³² in order to help them learn a new skill, or communicate with someone else in the same field. 

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



We still have a lot in common, so even though we've grown up and moved to different cities, we still keep in touch fairly often. It's really nice to have those close friendships that last for years.

2. What do you think of social media?

It seems to me that social media is <u>both a blessing and a curse</u>²¹⁴. On the one hand, social media allows us to <u>stay connected to a degree that wasn't possible before</u>²¹⁵. We can constantly check in with one another and share important moments from our lives with friends and family. However, it also means that our interactions and posts can become very <u>shallow</u> and based on likes rather than a genuine desire to share and maintain connections. It can also make us very vain and self-involved.²¹⁶

3. Do you think social media will replace face-to-face communication?

No, I don't think social media will replace face-to-face communication. Social media definitely <u>fills a gap in some people's lives</u>²¹⁷, especially when they can't see their friends and family on a daily basis. It helps them <u>stay close over distance</u>. However, I suppose that people will always prefer in-person interactions over chatting via social media. Seeing a loved one face-to-face is way better than texting or <u>instant-messaging</u>²¹⁸ them. So I don't think that social media could ever compare or come close to replacing that.
