




They're definitely <u>a life-saver<sup>15</sup></u> when you're <u>in a rush to catch up</u> on<sup>16</sup> some class content.

#### 8. Why did you choose your school / university?

Well, when I was a high school student, I heard my university has a really good undergraduate program for Computer Science<sup>17</sup>, which is really what <u>I'm passionate about</u> and love to study. Besides, my parents also <u>rooted for 18</u> me to go there as they believe four years of study there would be <u>a big help for my future career</u>.





#### 6. What technologies do you often use at work? (高频)

I don't use anything <u>super complex<sup>39</sup></u> at work. There's an online application that we use to chat with each other. But it's not difficult to use. <u>I'm not a tech wizard by any means<sup>40</sup></u>. I just use <u>standard word-processors<sup>41</sup></u> and other typical office software. Most of my job involves phone calls and emails. <u>It's nothing fancy<sup>42</sup></u>.

#### 7. What is the most interesting part of your job?

I work at a coffee shop, so I think the most interesting part of my job is the people. I get to meet so many people <u>during my shift</u><sup>43</sup>. Some of them have fascinating personalities. Sometimes I even <u>strike</u> <u>up a chat with</u><sup>44</sup> them and <u>learn something random</u>. One time a customer showed me photos of his cat.

#### 8. Which part is difficult in your job?

I think the most challenging part of my job is communication within a team. It's often difficult to communicate with someone who didn't finish their part of the work in time. They may think you're pushing<sup>45</sup> them, which can even create conflict.

#### 9. How do you spend your work day?

I usually arrive at the office before 9am and start my day with 46 a morning meeting with my boss and co-workers, which really helps me and others know the agenda of the day 47 as well as keep everyone on the same page 48. Then the long day of work begins and I need to work overtime until 8pm 49 most days.

#### 10. Is it better to work in the morning or in the afternoon?

I think it's better to work in the morning. Even though you have to wake up early, when you get through the work<sup>50</sup> you have the rest of the day off. And the afternoon is usually a better time of day to enjoy yourself. So it's best to get work over with<sup>51</sup> as early as possible.

#### 11. Have you ever changed your job? / Why did you choose to do that type of job?

But in a real job, a ton of tasks need good teamwork and can't be done <u>on your own</u>. For instance, when I coordinated a marketing event with my colleagues, <u>it was of the essence to<sup>54</sup> make sure everyone was on the same page<sup>55</sup></u>, or else we might've <u>messed up<sup>56</sup></u> the whole thing.

#### 13. Which do you think is more important, colleagues or work itself?

I think that colleagues are more important. You could be <u>doing your dream job</u>, but if it's with <u>people</u> <u>you can't stand<sup>57</sup></u>, you aren't going to enjoy it <u>as much</u>. You <u>end up seeing your coworkers more than</u> <u>anyone else in your life<sup>58</sup></u>, so it's important that you can get along with them.

#### 14. What do you do to improve your productivity?

Whenever I feel like I've lost focus on work and started <u>slacking<sup>59</sup></u>, I <u>take a 5-minute break</u> and make a cup of instant coffee. It sounds simple but <u>it works like a charm for me<sup>60</sup></u>. After I've had some coffee, I feel pumped up<sup>61</sup> and have more energy.


#### 6. Do you think sending emails will be more or less popular in the future?


#### 7. Do you think it's healthy to wear headphones or earphones?

#### 6. How do you find different apps?



#### **Topic 31 Concentration**





#### 7. Do you remember a time when you needed to cooperate with others?




