So this video really **caught** my interest<sup>148</sup>. Plus, you can tell when watching the videos how much this dad **loves** his kid. It's really **sweet** and **endearing**<sup>149</sup>. So I decided to **follow** his account. I thought it was a **great** way to learn **more** about being deaf while also enjoying some **funny** content of a father and daughter.

I find **all** of the videos really cool. They're often the **highlight** of my day<sup>150</sup>. I've even picked up<sup>151</sup> a few **phrases** in **sign** language. It's really **interesting** to learn about people with **different** experiences. Plus, the kid is really **funny** and always **jokes** around with her dad. She is an optimistic child with a **sunny** disposition<sup>152</sup>. Every time I see her, she cheers me **up** and I have **more** energy to deal with the **setbacks**<sup>153</sup> in my life.
