The **next** week when we met again, he told me **happily** that my advice **worked** and his boss agreed to **postpone** the deadline³⁴. So the team chemistry improved **a lot** as well. I was **over** the moon that I **could** help him out.

I think it's a really **positive** change because I'm **way** more productive now. I have the ability to **focus** my mind and energy on my **goals** and **persevere** until they are accomplished⁴². And I became more **confident** as well. I believe I can do things **well**. You know, self-control is one of the most **important** factors for **achieving** my goals, whether they're **big** or **small**.

After around **two** hours, people started to get **tired** and **antsy**⁷¹. The classes get your **heart** rate up¹³⁵, but they also teach you how to work your **muscles**. When I was doing it **multiple** times a week, I was probably the **most** fit I have ever been in my life¹³⁶. Now that I do it **less often**, I **don't** feel the effects as much¹³⁷, but I really **enjoy** it nonetheless. I also really like the **structure** of the class; I don't know a lot about **personal fitness**, so having an **instructor** tell me exactly what to do and how is **super** helpful.

If I have a **big** deadline coming up¹⁴³ and a **lot** of work to do, I feel better about it in a **calm** environment. Instrumental music helps me create **that** environment.

I think that music is helpful because it activates an **important** part of your **brain**¹⁴⁴. There are even studies that have been done that indicate the **benefits** of listening to **classical** music while studying. For me, it is something that I have been doing for **years** and will **continue** to do, because as **far** as I can tell, it works like a **charm**¹⁴⁵. It helps me concentrate when my mind might like to **wander** elsewhere¹⁴⁶.
