## North, South, East and West - Usage

Each of the points of the compass (north, south, east, west, south-east, north-west etc) can be:


- noun The sun rises in the east.
- adjective It is sunny on the east coast.
- adverb We drove east for 50 miles.

Look at some more example sentences:

Penguins live in the <b>south</b> .	noun
The wind is coming from the east.	
He lives in the <b>south-east</b> of England.	
He lives in <b>South</b> London.	adjective
The storm will reach the <b>north-west</b> coast tomorrow.	
Polar bears live at the <b>North</b> Pole.	
Penguins live at the <b>South</b> Pole.	
Is the country <b>South</b> Africa in the <b>south</b> of the African continent?	adjective   noun

Our house faces south-west.	adverb
Our car broke down a mile <b>east</b> of the city.	
He lives <b>south</b> of London.	

In the picture below, notice the important difference between "in the south" and "to the south" or just "south":



Here are some more examples:

- Paris is in the north of France.
- Sweden is north of France.
- Belgium is to the north of France.
- Canada is north of the USA.
- The USA is north of Mexico
- Mexico is south of the USA.
- Europe is west of Russia.
- Europe is to the west of Russia.
- Shanghai is in the east of China.
- Japan is east of China.
- Japan is to the east of China.
