In terms of what kind of clothes she wears, well, she is <u>very brave with</u> <u>edgy and less common (小众的) designs</u>. She's not afraid of <u>taking risks</u>, <u>breaking the rule</u>, and trying new trends. Just to give you an idea, <u>sometimes she'll wear a neon pink jumpsuit</u> (连体裤) with sexy <u>high</u> <u>heels</u> (高跟鞋); <u>sometimes she'll wear a black men-suit</u> (男士西服套装) with a red <u>beret hat</u> (贝雷帽); <u>sometimes she'll wear a vintage dress</u> (复古 连衣裙) with a pair of <u>white sneakers</u> (白色板鞋) ...<u>It seems that</u> in her world, <u>there's no limit when it comes to fashion</u>.

And finally, <u>to answer the question of why</u> she likes fashion so much, I guess, first, she is in <u>an industry</u> where "the look" is <u>heavily emphasized</u> (她处在一个外表被非常重视的行业中); and then, Xin herself is very <u>into</u> fashion. I remember, once she told me that she really enjoyed expressing herself through the way she dressed (她非常享受通过着装方式来表达自己). I feel inspired by her. And I should also try to <u>come out of my comfort zone</u> (走出舒适区) <u>from time to time</u>, and have some fun.

#### Part3:

1.Do you think online shopping will replace in-store shopping in the future? Why?

Nowadays, more and more people prefer <u>shopping online</u>, as it's easier, faster and less effort. Especially since the pandemic, many people have been trying to <u>avoid crowds</u>(避免人群). <u>Shopping online</u> is such an ideal way to buy things. <u>Physical stores</u>(实体店) are losing its consumers to online stores, and many of them <u>have been closed permanently</u>(永久关店). However, I wouldn't say that online shopping will <u>completely replace</u>(完全取代) in-store shopping, and the reasons are, <u>A</u>, some people still enjoy <u>browsing around between stores</u>(在店和店之间闲逛) and at the mall. It's not just about buying things, it's also about <u>passing their time</u>(消磨时光). Sometimes you see friends <u>kicking back</u>(百无聊赖) at the

mall. For them, it's a spot for meet-ups(见面地点). And B, some people, especially older people, don't know how to shop online. They still prefer going to a <u>physical store</u>, seeing and touching the product for real. (转 折,分群体)

2.Why is fashion very important to some people?

Well, I think, for some people, fashion helps them <u>make a good first</u> <u>impression</u>(制造好的第一印象), especially <u>in the workplace(在职场)</u>. A person who <u>dresses up nicely</u> and with <u>a good sense of fashion</u>(有好的时 尚品味) usually <u>earn more trust(获得更多信任)</u> and <u>gain more favour(更</u> <u>受喜欢)</u>. I guess, people's mindset behind it is, "If you can take care of yourself so well, you probably can take care of other things"(人们背后的想 法是,你既然把自己照顾的这么好,你应该能顾好其他事情吧). <u>And then, for some</u> <u>people</u>, they express themselves through the way they dress(通过穿衣方式 表达自己). They <u>make a statement(发表宣言)</u> through clothes. For example, different colours can show different emotions or personalities. And in the 1920s in China, women started abandoning <u>lose-fitting clothes</u> <u>(宽松版本的衣服)</u> and wearing a type of <u>slim-fitting</u> dress(紧身连衣裙), called Qipao. Qipao really <u>highlighted their curves</u>(突出曲线). It's <u>a</u> <u>symbol of freedom and independence</u>(是自由和独立的象征) in modern women in China. <u>And lastly</u>, I guess, fashion can also help people <u>build</u> <u>their self-esteem, their confidence</u>. If you are a nice <u>dresser</u>, you feel good about yourself. That means you love and respect yourself. (罗列分群体+举 例子)

3.Are older people as fashionable as young people? Why? Some older people are just as fashionable as young people. For example, my aunts and my mom. They love the most <u>on-trend</u>(流行的) clothes. In their world, they will never <u>let age become a problem</u>(让年龄变成问题). Age will never <u>stop them from being fashionable and stylish</u>. But I have to say, I also see many older people start <u>dressing down(穿衣降级,朴素)</u> once they are older. They are very <u>old-fashioned</u>. They think older people should <u>keep a low profile</u>(保持低调), wear darker colours, and more <u>loose-fitting clothes</u>.(分群体+举例子)

4.Are women more fashionable than men? Why?

In general, on the whole, I would say so(总的来说,我觉得是的). Most women love keeping up with the latest fashion trends(紧跟时尚潮流). I guess, it's a <u>cultural thing</u>(文化所致). In most societies, women are the ones who are supposed to be beautiful, charming and attractive(在大部分 社会,女人是应该美丽动人的群体). Just look at those Hollywood movies. The leading actresses(女主角) are always super gorgeous, whereas the actors sometimes are just some <u>average-looking guys</u>(普通平均颜值男的). And <u>on top of that</u>, there're so many more options for women than for men in the stores when it comes to fashion. It's easier for women to be more <u>fashion-minded</u>(有时尚头脑的). It's all about cultural education. However, nowadays I see more and more men <u>breaking the social</u>

<u>stereotype</u>(打破社会成见), and embracing fashion as much as women. I feel happy for them. (主流情况,特殊情况补充)

#### Part3:

1. What qualities make a role model?

First, a role model should be talented and skillful in a field. They need to be <u>good at something</u>, so that people admire them, and <u>look up to</u> them. And then, they should be <u>influential</u>, <u>inspirational and positive</u>. They have the kind of quality that inspire people to become better. They are the <u>muse</u> for people, <u>a ray of sunshine</u> (一缕阳光). And next, a role model is honest and reliable, meaning, <u>they do what they say they will</u> (他们说到的 <u>事会做到</u>). They are <u>doers</u> (做实事的人) rather than <u>talkers</u> (说空话的人). A role model always <u>set good examples for people</u>. Finally, a role model should also be <u>empathetic</u> (有同理心). They can listen and pay attention to people. They care about others. (罗列)

2. Why should children learn from role models?

Children are not <u>born to</u> be able to <u>tell right from wrong</u>(孩子不是生来就会 明辨是非对错的). They need positive influences. A role model is a person, usually children's parents and caregivers(一般是家长和照料者), that serves as an example by influencing children <u>for a lifetime</u>(跨域一生的时间). Children should <u>look up to(仰视崇拜)</u> their role models and learn from them in order to <u>pick up good habits</u> and <u>manners(培养好习惯和礼貌)</u>, to become a <u>stand-up and countable person</u>(堂堂正正、靠得住的人) in the society. If children didn't learn from their role models, or the people who're supposed to <u>set good examples</u> for children didn't behave well, that would <u>result in</u> really negative outcomes. For example, children whose parents smoke are more likely to smoke themselves.(原因,反向假

设,举例子)

3. Who can influence children more, teachers or parents?

I would, <u>in the early years</u> of children(早期), parents as the <u>number one</u>

(第一重要的) caregivers, they <u>serve as</u> the main role models. Children are more influenced by their parents because they spend more time together. Parents <u>mean everything (意味着一切)</u> to their children. <u>And later</u>, when children go to school, they learn things from their teachers, and that's when teachers start influencing the thinking of children. Sometimes you can see a child respect the teacher <u>so much to the point that</u> they only listen to what the teacher says. But I have to say, later on, when children become teenagers, they become much more attracted to their friends. That's when their friends will be the major influences. (分情 况分时间段)

There were no conflicts or anything. We were like mind-twins (思想上的双胞胎)." I want to talk about my <u>childhood bestie/best friend(儿时最好的朋友)</u> Wei. We've known each other since primary school, and she's like a sister, a family member to me.

And moving on the reasons why I liked her so much, well, <u>number one</u>, she was so <u>comfortable to be with</u>(相处起来很舒服). She was the most <u>down-to-earth</u>(接地气), chill(放松的,松弛的) and easy-going(随和的) person. I felt like I didn't need to change who I am when I was with her

(我和她在一起的时候不需要改变我是谁). I felt very relaxed and <u>at ease</u>(放心) when she was around. <u>And number two</u>, she and I were very similar. We were like <u>mind-twins</u>(思想上的双胞胎), <u>on the same wavelength</u>(一个波长频道上). We really <u>thought alike</u>(想法相似), and we <u>got each other's</u> jokes(懂彼此的笑点). <u>Talking to her was like the easiest thing on earth</u>(和 她聊天就像是世界上最简单的事情). <u>And finally</u>, she was a kind and generous person. ### Part3:

2. How important is childhood friendship to children?

Friendship is <u>a vital part</u>(至关重要的部分) of children's physical, mental and social development. From a physical perspective, when children play together, they learn to use their bodies to compete in games. They can <u>challenge their physical strength</u> and <u>push the boundaries</u>(做游戏,挑战自 我,突破极限). And then, from a mental and social perspective, they form <u>bonds of friendship</u>(建立友谊的纽带), and at the same time, <u>gain a sense</u> of belonging, security and community(收获归属感、安全感和团体感). They learn to be a part of a bigger group. Through friendships, children learn about <u>social cues</u>(社交暗示/信号,比如什么时候该说什么话,不该说什么话) and how to interact with others. And <u>what's more</u>, they learn how to <u>think for</u> <u>others</u>(为他人着想). Children learn <u>empathy</u>(同理心) through friendships. A child without any friends would be most likely <u>socially</u> awkward(社交尴尬的) and <u>lacking empathy</u>. (分角度分类讨论+反向假设)

3. What do you think of communicating via social media?

My mind is conflicted (我很矛盾). On one hand, social media helps people better <u>connect with</u> their friends. They can communicate with friends more easily, especially with friends who are far away. And social media provides <u>online platforms</u> where people can share their lives with friends. People get to conveniently <u>share their tears and laughter</u> with people through social media, so they <u>feel emotionally supported</u>. But <u>on the</u> <u>other hand</u>, social media is killing friendships as people don't have the motivation to see each other <u>face to face in real life</u> anymore. When you see a photo of your friend <u>popping up</u> in your <u>social media feed</u> (当你在社 交媒体界面上看到朋友的照片弹出来时), when you <u>press the "like" button (点</u> <u>赞)</u>, you think you have communicated with that friend, but have you really (你真的有吗) ? I don't think so. That's why I think social media sometimes makes people even lonelier. (分头讨论)

4. Do you think online communication through social media will replace face-to-face communication?

I hope not! But, like I just mentioned, people are increasingly <u>reluctant to</u> (抗拒) get out of their homes and meet people <u>face to face</u>, as communicating through social media is too easy, too <u>effortless</u> (不费力气 的), it's <u>at your fingertips</u> (动动手指). So, yeh, I definitely have seen this trend of more <u>cyber communication</u> (网络沟通) and fewer <u>physical</u> <u>meetups</u> (线下见面), especially after the pandemic. So, in the future, <u>I</u> don't see why this trend won't continue. With that being said, will social media <u>completely</u> replace <u>the good old style of communication</u> (曾经美好 又老派的交流方式)? I don't think so either. I still have hope on people! Nowadays, I see some of my friends <u>cutting down on</u> social media and <u>going back to</u> physical communication. I think some people still <u>cherish</u> (珍惜) these face-to-face moments. (时间分层,主流现象,自己观点) Describe a person you know who is from a different culture(认识的不同文 化的人)

#### Part3:

1. Where and how can we get to know people of different cultures better?

Nowadays we can know people from another country through social media. We can have a direct conversation with a foreigner <u>at our</u> <u>fingertips</u>. <u>Prior to this</u>(在这之前), people got to know people of different cultures mainly through traveling. And also, by reading foreign books or watching foreign movies, people could learn about foreign cultures and people.(时间分层)

2. What are the advantages and disadvantages of cultural diversity?

The pros of cultural diversity are, number one, it provides people with wider experiences. It's educational for people. People get to learn about different <u>cultures, traditions and customs</u>(风俗). They become more knowledgeable, educated and open-minded. And number two, that <u>results in more tolerance and acceptance</u>(宽容与接受度) between people. Without knowing diversity, people are <u>ignorant and narrow-minded(傲慢</u> 又狭隘的). <u>Number three</u>, cultural diversity also brings more <u>creativity</u>, innovation and productivity, especially in the workplace. When there're multiple cultures in one place, people can inspire each other through cultural exchange. Learning different values, perspectives, and interpretations in life and at work (对生活和工作的解读) will create <u>unexpected outcomes</u>(意想不到的结果). Those are the pros of diversity, ideally(理想角度来说). In the reality, sometimes the pros turn into cons. For example, cultural exchange might cause tension and conflicts, as people oftentimes prefer to be with their own people. Especially, different cultures have different languages, therefore chances are (很有可能), people will experience language barriers and cultural barriers at the same time. It's hard to expect people to accept one another easily. Therefore, the <u>cost of communication</u> will be higher; and there might be more conflicts. When people have conflicts, it might generate <u>cultural tribalism</u> (部落抱团文化,高分词汇). (分类讨论)

3. How can traditional culture and other cultures coexist?

That's a <u>tricky question</u>. It's hard to keep the traditional culture, as most people only care about <u>the time they live in</u>. That's why we are losing our own traditions and root. However, when I look around, I see some inspirations. For example, in China, some fashion designers have successfully combined traditional elements and modern elements together. Because them, it has become super <u>on trend</u> to wear "Hanfu" nowadays, which is a type of ancient clothing <u>originated from Han</u><u>dynasty</u>. Or, there're <u>competition shows</u> on TV that are about <u>ancient</u> <u>Chinese poetry recitation</u> (中国古诗背诵). People go to those shows and recite poetry, and win big prizes. Those TV shows make traditional cultures fun to watch. I guess these are the main tricks, A, to make it close to our lives, like things your can use or wear on a daily basis; and B, to make it fun and rewarding. (举例子)

#### 4. Which traditions are disappearing?

There're so many! <u>First thing</u>, traditional foods are disappearing around the world. Nowadays people have very little time and patience for cooking. They buy <u>pre-cooked food</u> from grocery stores, or <u>order takeout</u> <u>food</u>. Traditional cuisines are too delicate and <u>time-consuming</u> for most people today. <u>And then</u>, <u>traditional handicrafts</u> (传统手工). Again, those handmade products are very <u>energy-consuming</u> and <u>time-consuming</u>. Therefore, in a time when most products are <u>mass-produced</u> (大宗生产), people are losing the culture of handmade products. <u>What else</u>, festival traditions are <u>dying out</u> (灭绝) as well. Nowadays, only a few people know how to celebrate festivals <u>in a truly traditional manner</u> (真正的传统方 <u>式)</u>. Festivals are purely about food and family. People don't care about respecting traditions anymore. (罗列)

Vegetables that do well in containers or gardens include beans, beets, carrots, collards, cucumbers, eggplants, garlic, kale, leeks, lettuces, mustard greens, peas, peppers, potatoes, spinach, squash, and tomatoes.

So, my grandma is a typical <u>plant lady</u>, <u>so to speak(所谓的)</u>. She definitely <u>has a green thumb</u>. And she has this <u>special knack for making</u> <u>any type of plant grow well</u>. I think she's incredibly <u>gifted</u> when it comes to growing plants. She's a <u>natural</u>(天生的天才).

<u>In terms of</u> what plants she grows and where, well, my grandma lives on the first floor of her <u>apartment building</u>, so she has a <u>small garden</u>. She plants things in her garden and in her apartment as well.

In her small garden, she mainly plants <u>vegetables and fruits</u>, such as tomatoes, potatoes, lettuces, cucumbers, peppers, eggplants, carrots, strawberries, raspberries, and grapes. Oh yeh, she also has a <u>rose fence</u>

(玫瑰覆盖的围墙) that is full of red and pink roses. It looks stunning when all the roses are <u>blooming</u>(绽放) in the summer. And the <u>fragrance</u>(芬 芳), oh my god, that's what I imagine the smell of heaven(我想像的天堂的 味道). Haha!

And then <u>in terms of</u> the indoors, she has a lot of <u>ivy plants</u>, especially <u>devil's ivy</u>. Because <u>ivy plants</u> are long and can <u>trail</u>(蔓延). My grandma loves <u>hanging plants</u>(悬挂式的植物) that can <u>trail down</u>(往下延伸). So, she often puts them <u>high up on the shelves</u>(放在置物架上), or <u>on top of</u> <u>the fridge</u>(冰箱顶上), so that they can <u>drape over</u>(坠下来) and look like a plant waterfall (看起来像植物瀑布). And what else, there're also bigger plants like <u>snake plants, ferns</u> and <u>aloes</u>.

And finally, <u>regarding why</u> she enjoys <u>taking care of plants</u>. Actually, I've asked her this question. And her answer was, <u>first</u>, plants make her happy, <u>plain and simple</u>(简单又直白). <u>And then</u>, it's healthier and more <u>economical</u>(划算的) to have <u>homegrown</u>(自家种的) vegetables and fruits. <u>And what else</u>, they're <u>beautiful to look at</u>, and they are <u>decorative</u> for the home. They <u>make a home look cozy</u>(让一个家看起来很温馨). <u>And</u> another reason was, plants give her something to take care of <u>other than</u> herself(给她除了自己之外的事物去照料). You know, she's retired and has nothing much to do at home. Therefore, caring for those plants <u>is the best</u> way to while away her time. Which I totally understand.

So, yeh, that's my grandma, the best <u>gardener</u> that I know. Thank you!

#### 1. Are there many people growing their own vegetables now?

I think so, <u>I've read somewhere that (引经据典时的句型)</u> especially ever since the <u>pandemic</u>, there has been a "<u>gardening boom</u>"(园艺风潮) around the world. I guess, people today are <u>stressed out</u> and <u>anxious</u> for all kinds of reasons. Lockdowns could be one of the main reasons. Growing plants and vegetables in the backyard, garden or balcony can <u>get them distracted</u>, and <u>find inner peace</u>. Especially growing vegetables, there's a lot of <u>physical work</u> involved, you need to <u>turn over the soil (翻 ±)</u>, <u>dig holes (挖洞)</u>, <u>put fertilizer (施肥)</u>, <u>water the plants (浇水)</u>, all kinds of things. When people <u>immerse themselves in gardening (把自己淹</u> 没在种地里), they forget about their depression and worries. They gain a great sense of joy (很强的喜悦感). Some even say that gardening is their salvation (救赎). And <u>on top of that</u>, once people have their own homegrown veggies (家养小蔬菜), they have created an easy access to healthy green food. That's a big <u>bonus (奖励, 好处)</u>! (原因, 补充)

2. Do you think it's good to let kids learn how to plant?

OH my god there're SO MANY, <u>numerous</u> benefits of teaching kids how to plant. <u>I don't even know where to start</u>. <u>First</u>, it can <u>foster a love of nature</u> in kids. And then, it can also help kids <u>develop a sense of responsibility</u>. Because they need to <u>water the plants from time to time</u>, <u>check on them</u> (检查植物), <u>care for them (照料植物)</u>. <u>And next</u>, they learn things about science as well, for example, the concept of <u>photosynthesis</u> (光合作用). And moreover, watching a plant grow taller and bigger and <u>thrive</u>, gives kids <u>a sense of confidence and achievement (自信感和成就感)</u>. They <u>feel</u> <u>competent</u> (感到有能力), like they can <u>take control over things</u> (能操控事情 走向). <u>And what else</u>, oh yeh, sometimes there can be teamwork involved, and that can <u>foster the idea of cooperation in kids (培养合作意</u> 识). I remember when I was little, my grandma always asked me to help her <u>move pots</u>(搬盆), dig holes, and water plants. I enjoyed helping her. It was a good <u>teamwork training</u>(团队合作训练) for me as well. (罗列+举例 子)

3. What do you think of the job of a farmer?

Farmers are very important people in the society, as they're the ones who provide food for us. Without farmers, people would <u>starve to death</u>(饿死). Especially in the old days, before industrial revolution, before the invention of <u>agricultural machines</u>(在工业革命之前,在农业机器被发明之前), farmers grew everything <u>with their bare hands</u>(徒手). That's why in China, the first poem/ children's rhyme we learn is about respecting and <u>empathizing with (共情)</u> farmers. It goes something like, every <u>grain of rice</u>(一粒米) comes from a lot of work and sweat. So, yeh, farmers <u>play</u> an essential role in the society. (原因,反向假设,举例子)

4. What are the differences between traditional and modern agriculture? Wow, <u>that's a tricky question</u>. <u>I'm not an expert on this</u>, but...<u>the way I see</u> <u>it</u>, <u>in terms of</u> tools and machinery (工具和机械), nowadays there're a lot of new and advanced technologies invented. They're <u>transforming and</u> <u>boosting the agriculture industry</u>. <u>As far as I know</u>, the farming systems around the world, especially in <u>developed countries</u> (发达国家) are mostly <u>automated</u> (机械化的). And that's why, <u>in terms of</u> the number of farmers in the field (农田), nowadays, there're <u>far fewer farmers</u> working and sweating in the field. Whereas in the past, like I said, farmers used to work so hard <u>with their bare hands</u> to grow food for us. (分类分角度讨论)

So, <u>it's</u>

<u>hard to generalize</u>. (分群体)

2.Why do some people like slow-paced life?

Some people <u>are tempted to</u>(被诱惑,想要做某事) leave the busy world and <u>live a simple and easy life</u> because they have overworked and felt overwhelmed before. They just want to <u>drop everything</u>(放下一切) and <u>find a real life again</u>(重新找到生活). Nowadays, you see some people moving from the city to the country, and living in a small <u>farm house</u>(农 村民宿), taking care of vegetables in the garden. That's because they're tired of <u>the hustle and bustle</u> in the city, and they want to <u>find their inner</u> <u>peace</u>(找到内心平静). And for <u>some elderly</u>, they move slower, and they become more sensitive to noises, therefore they prefer a peaceful and slow lifestyle.(分群体分情况)

3.Is being patient good for people? Why?

100% yes! <u>Patience is virtue</u>. Just like <u>that old saying</u>(那句老话), <u>Rome</u> <u>wasn't built in one day</u>. If you want to have or build something great, <u>chances are</u>(更大可能是) you need to be patient and wait. You need to <u>take your time</u>, <u>work on it</u>, and <u>make the decision later</u>. <u>Rushing your</u> <u>decision</u> makes you more likely to end up with <u>short-sighted solutions</u> <u>and unsatisfying outcomes</u>(冲动做决定会让你更有可能得到目光短浅的解决方案 <u>或者令人不满意的结果</u>). <u>However, that being said</u>, <u>over-waiting</u>(过度等待), being <u>over-patient</u>(过度耐心), could also be a problem. If you don't <u>make</u> <u>the right decision at the right moment</u>, if you keep waiting and waiting, that's called <u>being indecisive</u>(犹豫不决,缺乏做决定的能力). You might <u>end</u> <u>up missing out on good opportunities</u>(错过好的机会). (反向思考)

4.Are people less patient now than people in the past? Why?

Yes definitely. People today are so much less patient; we are so <u>irritable</u> <u>(急躁的, 易怒的)</u> and <u>frustrated</u>(挫败的、无助又焦虑的) all the time. <u>And 1</u> <u>blame</u> the technologies today (我要怪就怪罪如今的高科技). Today, we have our smart phones, the internet, social media, and live streams, we do every thing <u>in an instant</u>. We don't need to wait anymore. For instance, we shop online <u>at our fingertips</u>, we click and buy and <u>have the item</u> <u>delivered to our doors</u> the next day; we <u>scroll on the phone</u> and <u>get</u> <u>instant information</u> within a second; <u>our world is flooded with</u> short messages, articles and videos. A two-hour movie is too much, <u>let alone</u> reading a book (一部两小时的电影已经太长了,更别提花时间读一本书)! Our <u>attention spans</u>(注意力周期) are getting shorter and shorter. So, yeh, we are less patient. (原因, 举例子)

## Part3:

1.What do you do if you disagree with someone?

①<u>It depends on the individual</u>. If it's someone <u>I'm really close to</u> and <u>care</u> <u>about</u>, I will try my best to communicate and <u>exchange thoughts and</u> <u>idea</u>, try to <u>meet in the middle</u>(在中间相遇,互相理解) with that person. And if it's just a stranger or someone I know, I don't really care if they agree or disagree with me. Usually I'll just <u>play along</u>(应付了事,假装很合 作), sometimes even pretend that I have changed my mind, just to <u>save</u> <u>the argument(省了吵架的精力)</u>.(分群体)

②I hate <u>confrontations</u>(对峙冲突). So, <u>most of the time</u>, I will just <u>play</u> <u>along</u> and <u>nod along</u>(点头称是) to avoid arguments. The older I get, the less aggressive and <u>opinionated</u>(观点很强的人)I become. I've learned that it doesn't matter what others think. As long as I know what I think, <u>that's</u> <u>what matters the most</u>. <u>There's no need to</u> force people to agree with me. when I was younger, I was much more stubborn(固执), and I <u>had a lot of</u> <u>fights</u> with people around me. (时间分层)

2.How can we stop an argument from escalating into a fight?

I think, <u>first</u>, we need to <u>relax</u> and <u>chill out</u>. <u>Take a deep breath</u> and try to <u>clam down</u>. Don't <u>get carried away</u> by pure emotions. <u>And then</u>, we need to keep <u>being rational</u>, rather than saying things in an emotional way. Because words can really hurt people, especially when we are emotional. <u>And next</u>, don't let your ego <u>get in the way</u> (别让"小我"成为阻碍). If you walk into a discussion with the mindset of proving yourself right and better (如果你走进一场讨论是带着证明自己的心态), that you <u>are superior to</u> the other person, then you're not sincere. <u>And finally</u>, <u>having empathy</u> (有同理心) is also <u>key</u>. Being able to <u>put yourself into other person's shoes</u> (换位思考) can allow you to understand others more, and be more openminded. (罗列)

3.Who do you think should teach children to respect their teachers?

Parents should teach children to respect their teachers, as it's <u>basic</u> <u>education</u>. Not just teachers, everybody in this society <u>deserves respect</u>, and parents should make sure children are respectful to people. And then, teachers themselves should also <u>instill the concept of respect in (灌</u> <u>输</u>) children. Parents and teachers should <u>work together</u> on this one. (罗 列)

4. What disagreements do parents and children usually have?

There're so many types of disagreements and conflicts between parents and children. And most of them are related to <u>boundaries and respect</u>. Parents often attempt to <u>set limits with their children</u>. But, setting limits can <u>create tension</u>, <u>resulting</u> in conflicts. Especially with older kids, when they want to <u>practise their autonomy</u> (实践自主权) and <u>get rejected</u>, they get really frustrated and mad. For example, <u>curfews</u>(宵禁), hairstyles, cell phone use, and what to wear. Or things related to <u>bad habits</u>, like, smoking, drinking, drug use, thing like that.(举例子)

1. Do you think arguments are important?

<u>I'm definitely of the opinion that</u> arguments have a lot of value in people's relationships, therefore it's important to be able to argue. Some people would <u>avoid having any kinds of arguments</u>, because they hate confrontations and conflicts, and they find it too awkward <u>to patch things</u> <u>up</u> after the fight. But I think those conflicts can help us exchange our <u>true feelings and ideas</u>, as long as we are <u>for the purpose of</u> communication, not hurting others. (让位驳斥)

Yes, for sure, like I said, <u>that's the whole point of</u> having an argument(吵

The way I see it, we should be ready to be flexible, and <u>be willing to</u> change our views. Many of us get into a fight with expectations about how things should <u>turn out</u>, but we should <u>be open</u> to change our perspective as well, based on the new information we get from other people. However, <u>this doesn't mean</u> <u>that</u> we should always <u>bend to</u> the will of others. We should <u>be open to</u> the possibility. (反向思考)

So, <u>I know it might sound weird</u>, but in China, getting money as a gift is a very common thing. We call this kind of <u>monetary gift(货币化的礼物)</u> Hongbao, in English, it would be called "red pocket" or "red envelope", because the money is put in a red envelope. (西方文化,给钱做礼物其实是很

## 奇怪甚至没有礼貌的行为)

Every year, during Chinese New Year, I would receive <u>red pockets</u> from my parents, grandparents, and even uncles and aunts. It's a <u>cultural thing</u>. Basically, on Chinese New Year's Day, or other traditional festivals, young children and grandchildren <u>give their best wishes to</u> their parents and grandparents. <u>In return</u>, they're given hongbaos, wishing them good luck in the new year. And, <u>in addition</u>, when it's somebody's birthday, or on someone's wedding day, they also get hongbaos. You get the idea, right?

I remember, one year during Chinese New Year, my grandmother gave me a huge hongbao. The <u>red envelope</u> was extra big and extra thick!! I mean, my grandmother has always been giving me a lot of money as a gift, but that year the hongbao was <u>exceptionally big</u>(额外的大). And the reason was that it was the year I graduated from high school and became a university student. My grandmother was so proud and happy for me, therefore she decided to reward me with a big and fat hongbao!

I <u>opened the envelope</u>, it was 5000yuan in total! That was a huge amount of money for me. I didn't even know how to use the money. So, I asked my parents what I should do with it. They suggested me to buy something meaningful and <u>save up the rest</u>. And that's what I did. I spent about 500yuan on books and some music CDs that I liked. And I put the rest of the money in the bank. Eventually, I saved up 10000yuan in two years, and spent that money on a trip to Japan! That was the first time I learned to manage my money and save up to do something bigger.

## Part3:

1. Why do people rarely use cash now?

Our society has been becoming <u>increasingly cashless</u>(无钞票化的).

People, especially young people, have stopped using cash <u>on a daily</u> <u>basis</u>. Instead, they are using <u>credit cards</u> or <u>mobile wallet</u>s. It's faster to <u>pay in a cashless way</u>, and plus, credit cards allow you to <u>borrow money</u> <u>from future</u>. And not just the individual, all the banks in the world are encouraging people to use <u>credit cards</u> rather than real money, and they are <u>offering credit cards without credit scores</u> (银行们在不需要信用记录的情

况下发放信用卡). <u>Studies suggest</u> that people are more likely to spend money with a credit card, and banks would want people to spend more money. <u>And in addition</u>, after the pandemic, many people have a little <u>germaphobia</u>(病菌恐惧症). They see cash as <u>a tangible piece of paper (—</u> 张可以抓住的纸) that has a lot of germs (病菌) on it. (原因,分角度,补充)

2. When do children begin to comprehend the value of money?

I don't know exactly when, maybe around 5 or 6? I'm saying this number because I remember when I was around 5, my parents would ask me to buy snacks for myself, in order to teach me about money and math. <u>It was</u> <u>from that time that</u> I started to realize that <u>almost everything came with a</u> <u>price(几乎所有事物都是有价格的)</u>. I even saved up for a doll when I was 6. So, I guess, it would be around this age. It could earlier or later, as every child is different. (举例子)

3. Should parents reward children with money?

Many people are saying rewarding children shouldn't be about money, as money is evil, and money makes people greedy. But <u>here's an unpopular opinion</u>(我的想法可能是要唱反调了, "不流行不主流"的观点), I actually think it's a good idea. Children can learn <u>the value of money</u>(钱的价值) at an early age, so they will be more <u>conscious/mindful</u>(有意识的、谨慎的) when spending money, and can comprehend how hard it is for parents to earn money. Many parents have the mentality of "You're just a kid. Don't you worry about money. It's my job to provide for you." But why cut children off this topic (把孩子隔离在这个话题之外)? Why put them in a bubble? They're also a part of the family. I think rewarding children with money can allow them to learn how to <u>manage money</u>(理财) and <u>control their desires</u>(控制欲望). It's a really good practise <u>to prepare</u> them for the future (是一个很好的为未来做准备的实践). (主流观点,自己观点) 4. Is it good and necessary to teach children to save money?

3. If someone doesn't really like who that they are going to meet, they may deliberately miss their appointment. Is that true? Why?

<u>I wouldn't be surprised to see that happen</u>(发生这样的事情不属于少见,我不 觉得意外), as I have done it myself a couple of times in the past. I've <u>made</u> <u>up excuse</u>s(编造理由) to avoid seeing someone I dislike. I know, making up a story, or you might call it "lying", sounds really bad, but I guess the pain of spending time with someone you really don't like is worse than the guilt of lying(和不喜欢的人相处带来的痛苦要差于撒谎带来的负疚感). <u>I'm not</u> <u>saying that</u> it's the right thing to do, but I understand why people would do that.(原因)

3. Which is more important, a work-related appointment or an appointment with a friend? Why?

<u>In most cases</u>, work-related appointments are more important. If you miss a work-related appointment, you will appear <u>untrustworthy and</u> <u>unprofessional.</u> Your client will be disappointed, and your boss will <u>put a</u> <u>hug question mark over your ability and professionalism</u>(在你的能力和职业 能力上放一个大大的问号). Friends normally are more understanding and can wait. I'm not saying that you can <u>stand your friends up</u>(stand sb. up 等于 <u>放鸽子)</u> all the time. But friendships are more relaxed and easygoing than work tasks. However, in some special cases, for example, when a friend is in the hospital, or it's their wedding day, or they're in a big trouble and really need your help, then you still should <u>put them first(把……放在第一</u>

位).(主流情况+特殊情况)

And if he manages to <u>stand on his own feet (自食 其力)</u> without any help, and he can surf every day, then <u>good for him (我</u> 为他开心)! He's a successful person <u>according to my definition</u>. (主流观 点,自己观点,举例子)

3. How do we judge whether young people are successful?

I try not to be the kind of person who <u>passes judgment on</u> other people (我努力不做对他人评头论足的人). Therefore, I don't know how to answer this question, really. <u>It's not my place to</u> judge(轮不到我来说三道四,不是我 的地盘).

4. Are successful people lonely?

<u>Maybe, maybe not</u>. I've seen and heard famous and successful people complain how lonely they feel. So probably some of them feel lonely. I guess <u>it makes sense that</u> successful people need to fight and work a lot in their fields. Instead of spending time with family and friends, they need to travel to another city for a meeting, or work on a new project. One of the websites had an app, so I downloaded the app. The recipe was so <u>easy to understand and follow (</u>特别好理解以及跟着操作), and there were even loads of pictures to <u>show me how the dish looked like in</u> <u>each step (告诉我每一步过程中菜长什么样).</u> The whole cooking process was like <u>a walk in the park (俚语,走在公园里一样,表示轻松), easy peasy (小菜一</u> 碟) !

Eventually, at the birthday dinner, my food <u>blew my parents away(把父母</u> <u>吹飞,意思是被震撼了).</u> They were so <u>impressed by my cooking skill(被我的</u> <u>厨艺惊艳到了).</u> My dad even said that I should become a chef one day! <u>Who knows(谁知道呢),</u> maybe he was just trying to please me. (真人秀), you will mostly learn nothing. But learning nothing is not necessarily a bad thing, you know? Sometimes we need to <u>chill out</u>, get distracted by some <u>light-hearted(轻松的)</u> TV shows in order to <u>unwind</u>.

3. Do you think libraries are still important in the digital age?

I would say that libraries will still <u>stay relevant</u>(保持重要性,保持知名度) in this <u>digital age</u>, even though they are <u>facing severe challenges</u>(面对严酷的 <u>挑战</u>). Here're the reasons. <u>First</u>, libraries are not only places where people go and read <u>paper books</u>. They also provide <u>easy access of</u> <u>computers and the internet</u> to the public. They <u>offer</u>(提供)/facilitate(组织) all kinds of <u>cultural and</u> <u>social activities</u> that <u>nurture local communities</u>(滋养当地社区). <u>And</u>

<mark>finally</mark>, <u>believe it or not</u>(信不信由你), there're are still some people, especially students and the elderly who love spending time in libraries, reading and studying. They are important for some people. (罗列原因) 4. Does the development of the internet have any impact on some disadvantaged people?

I can see some positive impacts on disadvantaged people. For people who are <u>physically challenged(残疾人)</u>. The web allows them to experience <u>fairness and liberty(公平与自由)</u>. So, I want to talk about the time when I went to a park and saw a lot of plastic trash.

It was about <u>a year and a half</u> ago, during spring time. I went to a big park called Yuyuantan. This park is famous for its <u>cherry blossoms</u>(樱花). Every year in spring, they have a big <u>cherry-blossom festival</u> for people to see the blossoms and enjoy some nice food and drinks. The idea sounds really good, but the reality is not so good.

Last time when I was there, I didn't enjoy the experience at all. <u>First</u>, it was <u>jam-packed</u>(特别挤). I could hardly move my feet. It was <u>like the</u> <u>whole world was there</u>(感觉像是全世界的人都去了). I saw not just cherry blossoms, but also <u>an ocean of people</u>(人山人海), which wasn't cool at all. <u>And then</u>, I saw trash everywhere. <u>Plastic packaging</u>(塑料包装), bags,

bottles, and paper napkins. The whole park <u>was littered with plastic</u> waste and food garbage. It looked so dirty and messy.

<u>In terms of</u> what I did, well, <u>I wish I could tell you that</u> I picked up all the litter, nice stories like that, but I can't(我倒是希望可以告诉你好听的故事,比如 我把所有垃圾都捡起来了,但是我并没有). I didn't do anything, as it was too

much garbage. But I made sure that I didn't throw any trash to the ground.

I felt very sad and angry to see things like this right <u>in front of my very</u> <u>eyes</u>(就在我眼前发生). I find it very selfish to litter in public. I'm shocked to see people don't have the <u>basic decency</u>(起码的素质礼貌) to hold their trash until seeing a trash bin. It <u>adds more work</u> to city cleaners, and it ruins the view(这种行为给清洁工带来更多工作,也会毁坏了景色). Especially in my city, you can find <u>trash bins</u> everywhere. So, it's even worse when people just litter like that. I really wish that there will be <u>harsher penalties</u> in the future to solve things like this(我希望将来可以有更严厉的处罚来解决这 样的问题).

#### Part3:

1. Do you think we should use plastic products?

No, everybody knows that plastics(各式塑料) are very pollutive to the environment. We should try to reduce <u>plastic use/consumption(塑料使</u><u>用、消耗)</u>. Today, all the seas <u>are filled with marine debris</u>(高分词汇,海洋 垃圾残骸,见"知识点"), mainly plastics, and all the <u>landfills are running</u> <u>out of space(所有的垃圾填埋场已经没有空间了)</u>. That's why people are trying to use <u>recyclable and reusable</u> products more, and consume fewer plastic products. But I have to say, it's very hard to stop using plastics completely, as most of the product <u>packaging wrappers(包装纸)</u> are still plastic. There's a long way to go(路还很漫长,任重道远).(原因+转折)

2. How can we reduce our use of plastic?

Well, <u>first</u>, we can <u>bring reusable bags</u> to the <u>grocery store</u>; <u>and then</u>, say no to <u>bottled water</u>; <u>and</u>, when we choose products to buy, try to <u>mindfully pick out</u>(有意选出) products with less plastic packaging. <u>And</u> <u>what else</u>, we can also learn the concept of <u>upcycling(变废为宝)</u>. It's

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basically about transforming unwanted and useless products and materials into something useful. So, for example, we can upcycle those <u>disposable food containers</u> into <u>home organization container</u>s(家庭收纳容

器). We can put grains, cookies, and <u>dry nuts</u>(干果) into those containers and keep our home organized. And <u>as a matter of fact</u>, nowadays I know that there're artists who would only use <u>recyclable</u> <u>materials</u> like plastics, glass and cardboard to create modern art. These are all things we could do. (罗列+举例子)

3. What kind of plastic waste are often seen in your country?

I would say, the most common type is plastic bottles. I see plastic bottles at bus stations, in the subway, in parks, on the street, everywhere. Plastic bags are also pretty common, but perhaps not as much as plastic bottles. I guess, they are lighter and <u>foldable</u>(可折叠的), so sometimes people

fold them and put them in their handbags, and reuse them later. (罗列)

4. Why do people like to use plastic products?

The way I see it, often times, people use plastic products because they <u>have no option (没得可选)</u>. When you go to a supermarket or grocery store, 99% of the products there are <u>wrapped with plastic packaging</u>. It's extra difficult to be the special one, to be responsible enough to NOT use any plastics. And on top of that, there are some advantages of plastics. First, plastic <u>keeps products free from contamination</u> (让商品不受到污染). Therefore, it's more <u>hygienic</u> (卫生的) to use plastic, particularly in medical field. And then, plastic packaging is so <u>durable</u> (耐操的) and thin. This means it uses fewer resources and <u>takes up less space</u> for transportation. (分角度 罗列)

So, I <u>consider myself an expert on</u> online shopping(我把自己视为在线购物的 小专家). It's easy, fast and convenient. You can order almost anything you like <u>at your fingertips</u> and <u>have it delivered to your door</u> just in a few days. But even an expert like me could <u>get burned</u>(吃亏、上当、受损、受骗) sometimes.

It was a month ago. I was browsing online and trying to find some clothes for work. I <u>came across</u> an online shop that seemed <u>legit</u>(正规的), and I loved everything they were selling. I very quickly <u>ordered</u> some shirts/blouses/pants for work. The prices were incredible. <u>It was like a</u> <u>steal(便宜得跟偷来的似的)</u>! And what was even better was that it was <u>free</u> <u>shipping</u>! I love websites with a free shipping policy!

The package <u>arrived at my door</u> in two days, which made me very happy. I <u>tore the package open</u>(tear sth. open 撕开)<u>with my bare hands</u>(不用工 具,纯粹用手撕). Yeh! That was how excited I was! And I started to try the clothes on. However, I was very disappointed.

All of the clothes were <u>of bad quality</u>. The shirts/blouses were <u>stiff and</u> <u>uncomfortable</u>. The <u>fabric looked and felt cheap</u>(布料看着和摸着很廉价). <u>They look nothing like the pictures</u> online. And the pants were not <u>true to</u> <u>size</u> at all. I mean I usually wear size L, and I couldn't fit in their size L at all.

Luckily, I called their <u>customer service</u> and <u>asked for a full refund</u>, they said no problem. So, I <u>returned</u> everything, and <u>got my money back</u> <u>eventually</u>. This experience told me that I need to be more careful when shopping online. It's not always a good experience.

That was the story, thank you!

#### Part3:

1. What kind of customer service do you think is good?

In my opinion, in <u>pre-sales customer service</u>(售前客服), the customer service advisors should be <u>patient</u>, <u>polite</u>, <u>and always with a positive</u> <u>attitude</u>. The service needs to be <u>prompt</u>(即使快速的). And also, the advisor should have <u>expansive knowledge</u>(很丰厚的知识量) of their products so that they can answer all kinds of tricky questions. And in <u>after-sales service</u>, customer service still needs to be <u>patient and</u> <u>62responsive</u>. And <u>on top of that</u>, they need to have <u>great problem-</u><u>solving skills</u>(解决事物的能力). Everything is aiming at <u>solving problems</u> and <u>shooting troubles</u>, and making the customer happy.(分类分角度讨论)

2.What are the differences between shopping online and in-store?

<u>Like I said, shopping online is easier and faster</u>. You can shop <u>anytime and</u> <u>anywhere</u>, even when you are doing something else, you can still be <u>multi-tasking</u>. It's definitely less <u>time-consuming</u> and <u>energy-consuming</u>. And <u>in addition</u>, the prices online are normally lower. <u>Meanwhile</u>, in-store shopping is more time and energy consuming. But upside is, <u>there's no</u> waiting around for the product to arrive (不需要等). You buy, you pay and you get the item <u>right there (就在那里)</u> at the store. And also, for some people, they feel more confident when they can actually see and touch the product by themselves, which makes sense. My online shopping experience just now would be a <u>case in point (正好说明了这一点)</u>. (对比讨 论) 3. What problems do customers often have while shopping? Usually, it's either related to <u>the product</u>, or <u>the customer service</u>. Things are <u>out of stock</u>(缺货), or <u>of poor quality</u>(质量很差), or things not working. And later when they pay, there might be <u>payment issues</u>(支付问 题). And after buying, customers might not be satisfied with the things they buy, and that's when there might be problems related <u>to after-sales</u> customer service. (分类分角度讨论)

4. What do you think customers should do when there are problems with products bought online?

One thing they can do is to <u>contact the customer service</u> of the online store, and tell them what the problems are and your expectations on how to solve the problem. If the problems are minor (很小的问题), and the customer feels lazy to communicate <u>one on one</u>, they can write a short <u>product review</u> (产品评测) to help the brand grow better (帮助品牌成长的更 好). (分情况讨论)

world. They are all very popular among the young in China. And <u>competition shows</u> like, American's Got Talent, and The Great British Bake Off, shows like that are also very <u>on trend</u>. Meanwhile, for the old, <u>not so much</u> (不是很多). I guess, A, it's mainly because of the language, and B, older people are not very used to the <u>western way of thinking</u> (西 式思维方式) and <u>western culture</u> (西方文化). Therefore, there's a <u>cultural</u> <u>gap (文化鸿沟)</u> there. So, yeh, young people are definitely loving foreign shows more than the old. (分群体)

3.What's the benefit of letting kids watch animal videos than visiting zoos?

I guess, when we show kids animal videos or documentaries, those animals are <u>in the wild</u>, free <u>in nature</u>. Kids get to see how they look when they run, hunt, play and <u>live their wild lives</u>(过自己的野生生活). But when we show kids animals in the zoos, they are <u>trapped in the cage</u> and looking very unhappy(被困在牢笼里看起来很不开心). It's sad to see animals like that. They shouldn't lose their freedom. (原因,转折)

Users get to express their ideas and tell their stories on the internet with everyone. In the past, only famous writers, radio hosts, TV producers and movie producers could tell the story, whereas nowadays everyone can tell their own version of story <u>in a public manner</u> (以公开的方式). ### Part3:

1. Why do people learn foreign languages?

Some people learn foreign languages <u>as a hobby(出于兴趣)</u>because <u>it</u> <u>feels good</u> to know other languages. <u>And plus</u>, they can make international friends and travel to other countries <u>with less effort</u>. Like(比

<u>方说)</u>, I have a good friend, she is a <u>polyglot</u>(5 门及以上语言使用者). She can speak 5 languages and she's learning a sixth one! Some people learn foreign languages <u>out of necessity(出于必要性)</u>. <u>Say(你比如说)</u>, if they are living in a new country, they have to learn the local language in order to survive. And some other people choose to learn a new language to earn more opportunities. <u>You can never go wrong with</u> knowing multiple languages(会说多国语言总是错不了的选择). It can <u>increase your job</u> prospects(增加就业前景), and even <u>add your salary</u>.(分群体)

2.What makes a good foreign language teacher?

<u>Speaking from my own experience</u> as an <u>English learner</u>(英语学习者), <u>the</u> <u>way I see it</u>, a good foreign language teacher should be, <u>first</u>, of course, very knowledgeable in both the language and teaching. <u>Many times</u>(很多

时候), a good language user doesn't equal to a good language teacher. Knowing how to speak a language is totally different from teaching a language. <u>And then</u>, a good language teacher should be very <u>encouraging</u>(鼓励人的). And the reason is that most students are very unconfident to use a new language, especially when they need to <u>open</u> <u>their mouths</u> to speak. A good teacher should be <u>inviting enough</u>(足够亲 和) to encourage students to <u>chime in(加入进来)</u> and speak with confidence. And this <u>goes hand in hand with(一起走,手拉手,表示同样重</u> <u>要) patience(这一点和耐心是同样重要的)</u>. When a student <u>is reluctant to</u> (不愿意) speak, the teacher should be patient enough to guide the student and wait for them to speak one day. <u>These are the things that I</u>

<u>can think of for now</u>(我现在能想到的就是这些).(罗列)

3.Do you think grammar is important when learning foreign languages?

I think so, especially if you are an <u>adult student</u>(成人学生). I mean, grammar is the foundation when you want to <u>structure a sentence</u> <u>correctly</u>(正确地组织句子). Without knowing <u>the proper grammar</u>(地道的 语法), the sentence you're saying might <u>sound wrong and funny</u>(听起来又 错又可笑), and <u>in a worst case/scenario</u>(最糟糕的是), <u>incomprehensible/</u> <u>not understandable</u>(不可懂的). <u>However, this doesn't mean that</u> you should <u>over-focus on grammar</u>(过度关注语法). Because that will <u>put you</u> <u>under a lot of pressure</u>. Sometimes, trying to be perfect will frustrate you <u>so much to the point that</u> you won't be able to <u>open your mouth</u>(试图完美 会让你焦虑紧张以至于不敢张口). <u>After all(毕竟)</u>, the purpose of learning grammar is to be able to use a language, not to <u>get intimidated</u>(受到恐吓 惊吓) by it. Just think about kids, they speak a language without knowing any grammar. Sometimes they say it right, and sometimes they say it wrong. It doesn't matter. <u>What's more important is</u> to be able to communicate. (原因+反向假设+反向思考+举例子)

4.Is it interesting to be a foreign language teacher? Why?

Hike the idea, yes. It sounds cool. Being a foreign language teacher means that you are very <u>fluent in</u> another language, and you can <u>share</u> <u>your knowledge and skills with your students</u>. That definitely can bring you <u>a strong sense of achievement</u>(带来成就感). And, <u>on top of that</u>, you will have more opportunities to work in another country, and make friends with people from other countries. It's like <u>a sea of people</u>(人山人海), a pot of dumplings(一锅饺子).(罗列)

2.Are those people who like dangerous activities more likely to be successful?

Yes and no. Yes, people who like <u>extreme sports</u> and <u>dangerous activities</u> are more <u>risk tolerant</u>(对风险更有包容力). They are not afraid of <u>taking</u> <u>risks</u>. And when you look at successful people in life, many of them are very brave. They are like <u>daredevils</u>, and make big decisions with full confidence. No, sometimes taking too many risks all the time is <u>a sign of</u> <u>irrationality</u>(非理智). <u>The thing is</u>, we need to <u>take calculated risks</u>(计算 <u>过的风险</u>), instead of making <u>emotional and intuitive decisions</u>(情绪化又直 觉性的决定). For example, if you don't have any experience in <u>scuba</u> <u>diving</u>, and the first time you dive, you choose to go really deep and dive alone, that's not called brave, that's called stupid. (分头讨论+举例子)

3.Do you think it's better for people to change jobs when there are new chances?

①It depends on the new opportunity, whether <u>it's worth the risk(值得冒这</u> 个险). Some new opportunities are so rare and precious, they're like "<u>once in a life time</u>" special(一辈子只有一次的机会). Then, yes, I say, <u>go for</u> <u>it(去追求吧)</u>. Change is inevitable(不可避免). <u>Don't miss the chance</u> <u>before it's too late(别等为时已晚).</u> But sometimes a new chance is just another chance, not a better one. People should <u>stay calm</u> and rational before they <u>take the risk</u>, and <u>make the decision</u>.(分情况)

②On one hand, staying put(保持静止,不动窝) in one <u>company over a</u> <u>long period of time</u> can help you <u>make deeper connections</u> and <u>prove</u> <u>your loyalty(证明你的忠诚度).</u> You will <u>earn trust</u> from your employer and potentially <u>gain more favour</u> in the company. Your life will be changeless, but very <u>stable</u>, which could be a big <u>pro</u>(优势) if what you're looking for is <u>stability</u>. Changing your job, <u>getting out of your comfort zone</u> could be <u>exhausting and scary</u>(累人又可怕). <u>But on the other hand</u>, job hopping <u>(跳槽)</u> allows you to learn new things, challenge yourself and <u>widen</u> <u>your world</u>. And you might <u>climb up the ladder</u>(爬梯,晋升) even fast. Because sometimes staying in one company for too long can <u>result in</u> the ignorance from your boss and coworkers, as you've been there forever, and people might <u>take you for granted</u>(把你视为理所当然).1 see that happen to many young people. They come to a company right after graduation, and they are forever the "new graduates"(永远的大学应届生, 永远的小年轻). (分头讨论)

4.Should young people try as many new activities as possible?

Yeh, definitely! And not just young people, older people as well. Life is <u>too</u> <u>short to wait around and hesitate</u>. Only through doing new things can we learn about this world and ourselves. What we like and dislike, what we are <u>good at</u> and <u>bad at</u>. However, we should also be <u>consistent</u>, and doing things <u>in-depth</u> (有深度的). Life is <u>horizontal and vertical</u> (水平+垂直) at the same time. (原因,转折)

My dad taught me how to cook. And actually, in the beginning, he <u>talked</u> <u>me into(说服我)</u> learning cooking. He's my cooking "mentor"(导师), haha.

He told me that it was a basic survival skill that everybody should know. And plus, cooking at home is super healthy and it saves a lot of money. # Part3:

1. What can children learn from parents?

Parents are role models (榜样) of their children. Children learn everything from parents. First thing that comes to mind (一个想到的), children learn about health from parents. When parents make eating healthy, working out regularly and getting enough sleep a priority (make something a priority 把...视为最重要), children will pick up on the message themselves. 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<u>life lessons to next generation(把人生课堂的心得传给下一代)</u>. These practical lessons can later benefit children their whole lives.(罗列)

2. Do you think some children are well-behaved because they are influenced by their parents?

①This is a typical <u>nature or nurture</u> question(这是一个典型的先天还是后天的问题). I would <u>go for(选择)</u> nurture. Parents are children's <u>role models</u>.
Children <u>look up to</u>(崇拜、仰望) their parents, and would copy everything they do. They want to <u>please</u>(取悦) their parents so much.
Parents who pay a lot of attention to children's education will <u>shape their</u> <u>manners and behaviour</u>, and <u>raise(抚养)</u> more wholesome children.(原因)

②Many people would say that children's behaviour is heavily influenced by their family. <u>Family education is key</u>(家庭教育至关重要). <u>But I don't see</u> <u>it that way. An example would be</u>, if you look at families with more than one kid, all the <u>siblings</u>(兄弟姐妹) can be very different <u>in terms of</u> personality, manner and behaviour. They're supposed to grow up in the exactly same environment, and yet they can be completely different. <u>Take my family for example</u>, my aunt has two kids, my older cousin is a very <u>respectful</u>, polite and calm person, and my younger cousin <u>is the</u> <u>opposite</u>. She is <u>reckless</u>(鲁莽的), rude and impatient. From my cousins, I realize that a person's personality and behaviour is mainly genetic, and partially influenced by parents. (主流观点,自己观点)

# 3. Is it necessary for adults to learn new things?

Definitely yes! Adults, no matter what age we are, should never <u>give up</u> on learning new things and <u>advancing ourselves</u>(提升自己). I see some people completely <u>stop trying</u> to learn more and become better. They think learning is for kids, and they've learned enough at school. And plus, their main jobs are working, <u>making a living</u> and <u>taking care of their</u> <u>families</u>. But I really don't like this <u>mentality</u>(心态). Learning new things makes a person happier and feel fulfilled. Having more skills can <u>increase</u> <u>a person's job prospects,</u> and help a person <u>stand out from the job</u> <u>market</u>. And <u>on top of that</u>, it's a wonderful spirit that can impact their kids. Inspire them to never stop learning and improving. Adults should <u>set</u>

good examples for the next generation. (让位驳斥)

Nowadays there are so many ways to learn new things. Some people learn by watching free online <u>tutorials</u>(教程) and learn a new skill on

their own. I know so many <u>self-taught(自学成才)</u> painters, guitar players, dancers and bakers around me. And then, <u>some people</u> learn new things from people around them who are skillful in something. For example, I learned cooking from my mother. <u>Some people prefer taking classes to learn. And today they can choose between <u>online classes</u> and <u>face-to-face</u> <u>classes</u>. Online classes are more and more favoured as they are usually</u>

much more affordable than traditional classes. (分群体)

Parents are <u>role models</u> <u>(榜样)</u> for their kids, therefore, kids might feel inspired by their parents when seeing the behaviour of sharing. <u>And finally</u>, parents can create <u>games of sharing</u> to <u>instill the concept in (灌输概念)</u> kids. For example, ask kids to share their friends, their food. Things like that. (罗列)

②<u>Here's an unpopular opinion</u>(我的想法可能不受欢迎,小众想法), but I don't think we should force kids to learn share if they are not ready to. So, <u>I say</u>, we don't teach them about sharing. And I know people would say that <u>sharing can built trust</u> and <u>encourage cooperation</u>. I do agree, but forcing kids to learn to share could <u>send wrong messages</u> to them(给他们带来错误 信息). ② Some do and some don't. there're young people who enjoy doing sports <u>on a day-to-day basis</u> to <u>burn up calories</u> and <u>get relaxed</u>. But I also see some young people (for example, me) who would hate to <u>practise</u> <u>sports!</u> I feel like they often <u>view sports as punishment</u>. Maybe because in high school, all of us hated <u>running laps</u> (跑圈儿). It truly felt like

punishment!(分群体)

2. What are the benefits of sports for children?

There are <u>numerous</u> advantages for kids to <u>play sports</u>. <u>A</u>, they can <u>have</u> <u>fun</u> and <u>blow off the steam</u> while <u>getting some exercises done</u>; and <u>B</u>, they can learn how <u>work together/collaborate</u> as a team. If children don't practise any kind of sport, they will <u>run the risk of becoming overweight</u> <u>(有超重的风险)</u> due to <u>being sedentary</u> (久坐的方式). That's why most parents and schools encourage children to <u>take part in</u> an after-school sport. (原因罗列+反向假设)

But I'm sure <u>there're more to</u> <u>it</u> (还有更多原因). (时间分层) 2. How can people improve the relationship with neighbours in a community?

There're several things we can do. First, we can start by being more friendly and respectful to our neighbours. We can <u>say hi to</u> (打招呼) them, ask them about their lives, and do some small things for them, things like that. And then, on some special days, like <u>New Year's Eve</u>, or some other national holidays, we can do a little gift, for example, just <u>knock on the door</u>, and bring some pastries or cupcakes. Honesty is <u>the foundation of a friendship</u>. People <u>earn trust(获取信任)</u> from being honest with each other. However, sometimes, even between friends, people still <u>tell white lies</u> to <u>avoid unnecessary conflicts</u> or to <u>protect each other's feelings</u>. For example, it's usually a very bad idea to tell your friend that they've <u>gained weight</u>. It's rude and hurtful, and it's also <u>none of your business</u>. (分情况)

<u>-It depends on how close you are(关系有多近)</u>. If it's a <u>close friend</u>, I think it's better to be honest. As a true friend, you need to be brave enough to <u>call your friends out</u>(质疑朋友), <u>correct their wrongs</u>(修正他们的错误), <u>keep them in check</u>(对他们保持监督). Especially when you see them <u>going down the wrong path(走错路)</u>, you need to stop them from making mistakes. True friends don't just have fun, they also teach each other, guide each other <u>to be a better person</u>. But if it's just a regular friend, someone you know, not your <u>bestie(最好的朋友)</u>, then you don't have to be the most honest with them. You just need to be respectful and polite. Because sometimes being <u>radically honest</u> can be very hurtful, you don't need to <u>take the risk</u> of hurting someone if they are not your good friends. (分群体)

But things are a little different for those so called "<u>influencers"</u> (网红). Many of them don't have a specific talent, they're famous just because they create interesting videos or photos online. So, for XXXX, she does the same thing. You can call her an "<u>online content creator</u>"(网上内 容制作者). Sounds fancy and ambiguous(听起来高大上又有点模糊), but it
just means she posts videos and photos of her life and herself online. So, if you ask me, what has she done, my answer is, <u>nothing much</u>, hahah.

People who are <u>trustworthy and keep their word(遵守承诺), people who can get things</u> <u>done on time(按时完成事情)</u> are more respected. Sometimes you hear people <u>promise the whole world(许诺全世界)</u> but nothing is done later. Finally, people who have <u>a fun personality(性格有趣的)</u> are usually <u>wellliked</u> at work. Nobody wants to work with a stressful and serious coworker. Working with this kind of people is always a pleasant experience. (罗列)

2.Are bosses more popular than employees at work? -Uhmm, <u>it depends on the individual,</u> right? I mean, some bosses are friendly and <u>humble</u>(谦卑), they listen to their people, and some bosses are <u>self-centred</u>(以自我为中心的) and disrespectful to people, basically,

There's a lot of <u>power relation(权力关系)</u> involved. People naturally want to please the boss, and that's why they show a lot of friendliness. And also, there's <u>peer pressure(集体压力)</u>. If everybody is being super nice and friendly to the boss, you feel like you have to do the same thing. (主

流观点现象,自己观点)

3.Which one is more important, keeping a good relationship with colleagues or doing well at work?

I would say, both. If you want to be truly respected, you need to <u>perform</u> <u>well</u> at work. Respect <u>doesn't come from nowhere (不是空穴来风)</u>, you earn it (是你挣来的). And <u>at the same time</u>, <u>having a good relationship</u> <u>with</u> colleagues is also very important. We are all <u>social animals (社会动</u> <u>物)</u>, and our working environment is like a small society. There're usually team works which require people to <u>work together</u> happily and effectively. <u>Getting along with one another (相处愉快)</u> makes communication easier, and <u>avoids misunderstandings</u>. <u>Imagine (试想)</u>, a person is very talented and <u>competent (有能力的)</u> in the workplace, BUT he/she is a <u>terrible communicator (糟糕的沟通者)</u>. Others wouldn't care how well he/she performs, they just don't want to work with this person. (原因,反向假设)

4.What benefits are there when a child is popular at school? Normally we see that popular kids at school are very confident, that's the first benefit. Having the feeling of being <u>valuable</u> (有价值), <u>worthy</u> (值得被 爱), <u>adorable</u> (可爱) makes those kids very confident ad <u>secure</u> (有安全 感) about themselves. And then, popular kids, of course, have a lot of friends. They always <u>have someone to talk to (有人可以聊几句)</u> so they don't feel lonely easily. 果) of doing so. That's why nowadays there're so many trolls(喷子)

<u>roaming around on the internet</u>, <u>seeking chances(寻找机会)</u> to attack people. Sometimes, they're not even saying their most honest opinions, their real goal is to upset and hurt people. So yeh, the internet is a safe place for people to communicate. This is a good thing, but at the same

time, so many people get trolled (被喷) online. It's always <u>a double-</u>

<u>edged sword(双刃剑)</u>.(原因,举例子)

4. What are disadvantages of sharing opinions on the internet?

Well, like I just said, when you share your thoughts on the internet, you never know if your opinion will offend, annoy or upset anybody. That could cause arguments, conflicts and hatred (痛恨). You might experience some really negative energy, and that's <u>the downside</u> of doing something like that. People might misunderstand you, over-read your words, or even start a fight with you. Nobody likes conflicts, nobody likes negative feelings, right? And then, privacy is also another problem. If you think about it, your opinion is also private. And nowadays many <u>influencers</u> (网红) are sharing their thoughts in videos, showing their faces at the same time. The moment they post those videos, they have lost a little part of their privacy. ### Part3:

1.How can we solve the traffic jam problem?

What we can do as citizens are, A, <u>use public transport</u> as much as possible, and B, <u>do carpooling</u> (汽车分享) more often, in order to decrease the number of cars on the road. From the government's perspective, they can improve the infrastructure of the city by building wider roads, and more <u>lanes</u> (更多车道). They can build more <u>roundabouts</u> (环状交叉路口). At the same time, they should also find ways to discourage people to drive cars in the city. For example, <u>charging drivers during the rush hour</u> (高峰小时收费), increasing <u>parking fees</u> (停车费) in the city, things like that. (特殊分群体讨论)

2. Do you think developing public transport can solve traffic jam problems? Oh yeh, for sure, 100%. That's what everybody is talking about, using public transport can improve the situation a lot. <u>I'm totally on the same page</u>. I went to London and New York City where most people would take the subway or the bus to <u>get around</u> (转悠) the city. Traffic isn't a big issue there. People have already accepted the fact that it's almost impossible to drive in the city, as parking fee is crazily high and there aren't enough parking spots(停车车位). At the same time, public transport is very accessible in these big cities. That's why people are more willing to <u>hop on</u> <u>the subway train</u>(跳上地铁) to go here and there. Therefore, developing public transport is key(是核心).(主流观点,自己观点,举例子)

3. Do you think the high ways will help reduce traffic jam?

I don't think so. Maybe a little, but they're not magical. I mean, <u>I'm not an expert on city traffic or road development at all</u>. I made the decision last year. At that time, I was about to graduate from my university in China. And, to be honest, I wasn't very happy with my options. I could start <u>finding a job</u>, but I wasn't ready to start working yet. I could <u>apply to graduate schools</u> in China, but I felt I was <u>missing out on</u> <u>something (错过一些事儿)</u>. I was <u>missing out on the opportunity</u> to see more things and <u>fulfill more potentials</u>.

I was <u>sitting on the fence</u> for months until I talked to my cousin. She changed my mind. I <u>turned to</u> her for some advice as she's studying in the UK. And She told me studying abroad was the best decision she made. She'd been learning and growing so much ever since she started her new life in the UK. She's much more independent, experienced and competent. After talking to her, I <u>made up my mind</u> to study abroad. And now, I'm very happy with my decision. I've been studying English every day, and busy preparing for my application materials. I'm feeling excited, determined and hopeful.

<u>It wasn't an easy decision to make</u> but I'm glad I <u>made the right choice</u>. Thank you!

1. What kinds of decisions do young people have to make?

Young people make all kinds of decisions in life, big ones and small ones. Bigger ones like choosing a university, making study plans, finding a job, getting married; smaller decisions like friendships and social life, boyfriends or girlfriends, what to eat, when to sleep, where to go. So, yeh,

they're <u>facing a lot of challenges</u> <u>when it comes to</u> making decisions.(分

2. Do you think young people are easily influenced by others while they make decisions? Why or why not?

<u>The way I see it</u>, young people are at an age when they don't have a lot of life experience yet, so they tend to listen to people around them, especially people who are more experienced. However, there're still some young people who are very <u>strong-minded</u>(有想法的、主心骨的) and <u>decisive</u>(果断的). They know what they want, and they don't easily get influenced by people. (主流情况,特殊情况)

3. Do you think some people can make decisions without asking for advice from others?

Some can, not everybody. Some people are very confident with their decisions. They <u>have good control over their lives(有很好的对人生的控制)</u>, and they think that they don't need to rely on anybody's help. And, some other people are <u>too proud to turn to others(太骄傲,不好意思问)</u>. They

<u>think too highly of themselves</u>(自视甚高), thereby feeling embarrassed to ask for advice. (分群体)

4. Do you think it's necessary for kids to make as many decisions by themselves as they can?

I think so. I think parents should encourage their kids to make decisions by themselves <u>at an early age</u>. Starting by giving them several options to choose from (一开始给他们一些选择). That's an easier way to make a decision. For example, "Do you want to go to the park today or tomorrow?" If the kid chooses "today", then he/she has made the decision of going to the park today. And later when they are older, parents can let their kids make decisions themselves, but they should remember giving them full information to <u>take into consideration</u> before the decision-making (在做决定之前,家长要给出足够信息让孩子去考虑). Like, what are the consequences of each decision, pros and cons, things like that. <u>One thing I have to add here is that</u>, I don't think letting kids make decisions means ignoring them, not paying attention to them, letting them choose freely without any guidance (让他们做决定不意味着忽视,冷漠, 任由他们自己做决定而没有任何引导). Parents should always provide information and guidance. That's very essential. (罗列, 举例子, 反向思考)

So, I want to share with you the time when I managed to <u>cook a difficult</u> <u>dish(做一道复杂的菜)</u> by getting the recipe online on my phone.

Eventually, at the birthday dinner, my food <u>blew my parents away(把父母</u> <u>吹飞,意思是被震撼了).</u> They were so <u>impressed by my cooking skill(被我的</u> <u>厨艺惊艳到了).</u> My dad even said that I should become a chef one day! <u>Who knows(谁知道呢),</u> maybe he was just trying to please me. I <u>was very</u> <u>flattered(受宠若惊)</u> for sure. Finally, regarding how I felt about the experience, well, <u>thank god(谢天谢</u> <u>地,幸亏)</u> I found the recipe on my phone, it made everything so easy. I never needed a cook book, just my phone and <u>the internet connection</u> <u>(网络连接)</u>, I could get any information I needed <u>at my fingertips(指尖)</u>. And, it was completely FREE. I felt grateful to be able to live in a time like this where information is so easy to access and so effortless to get.

So yeh, that was the story, thank you.

#### Part3:

1. What do you usually do with a cellphone?

I do a lot of things on my cellphone. I <u>set the alarm</u> on my phone every night before bed, and in the morning, the alarm will <u>go off</u> at 8 am to wake me up. I <u>listen to podcast</u> (听播客) while commuting to work/school every day. It's my <u>chicken soup for the soul</u> moment (我的心 灵鸡汤时刻), very important for me. I use my phone to contact people, my supervisor (上司), coworkers (同僚) and clients (客户) / professors and classmates. When I <u>have some time to spare</u> (有额外时间) during the day, I always enjoy <u>getting on</u> my social media accounts, and <u>taking a sneak</u> <u>peek at</u> (偷窥) what my friends and family are doing. Social media is a big part of my life. I also use my cellphone to play music when I work out. <u>Now come to think of it</u> (现在想来), I almost do everything using my phone. (罗列)

2. What are the differences between young people and old people when using a cell phone?

Well, <u>I can't speak for all the young and old</u>. <u>From what I see</u>, young people are much more <u>addicted to</u> the phone. Young people <u>use phones</u> <u>for life</u>(用生命在看手机), including myself. We <u>stare at</u> our phones almost <u>24/7</u>(全天全周在盯着手机). Sometime I feel that we 're not paying

attention to the real world anymore. Whereas old people use their phones more wisely, in my opinion. They also use the phone to read, talk to people, find a recipe, get directions, but they're not that <u>dependent on</u> their phones. Maybe it's because mobile phones are something that came to their lives later(手机对老年人的生活来说是比较晚进场的东西). (对比讨论)

3.Which one is more important, using a cell phone to make phone calls or to read messages?

They are equally important, the way I see it. Making phone calls is the <u>major feature</u> of all the phones. We use phones to contact people. And also at the same time, getting messages, receiving information, is also very essential. I don't know, I don't really understand this question, to be

1. Do you often help kids? How?

2. Why is it necessary to do volunteer services?

Because <u>people need people (人需要人)</u>. And <u>it works both ways</u>(两头都 有效), it's <u>beneficial for both the volunteers and the people helped (对志</u> <u>愿者和被帮助者都很好)</u>. Volunteers can help a community develop and <u>thrive</u> (蓬勃发展). They can take care of old citizens in the neighbourhood, they can help people who are <u>physically challenged</u> (残障 人士) to enjoy a better life, they can <u>clean up</u> the environment, <u>the range</u> <u>(范畴)</u> of volunteering services is <u>endless</u> (无止境的); and for the volunteers themselves, volunteering work <u>keeps them in regular contact</u> <u>with people</u>, which <u>in turn (作为回报)</u> protects them from depression and anxiety. Just like I said, people need people.

3.What can schools do to develop students' awareness of volunteering?

Showing documentaries to students about volunteering services is the first thing schools can do. I mean, the first thing is to <u>learn the idea, the concept</u> of helping people. And then, schools can <u>organize volunteering activities</u> that <u>enable students to experience and enjoy helping people</u>, and <u>giving back to the society</u> (回报社会).

### Part3:

1. What kind of things do people usually lose?

Normally people lose things that they use all the time, <u>on a daily basis</u>, and also it's normally <u>something small(个头小的东西)</u>. Like, their keys, phones, tablets, water bottles, wallets. You know, things that they <u>carry</u> <u>around</u> in their hands all the time, but are not easy to find <u>when left</u> <u>behind</u>(被丢下), because they're small. (原因,列举)

2. What do people often do when losing things?

Some will get crazy, and go back to places to find it. They still <u>have high</u> <u>hopes for g</u>etting it back; some will just <u>give up</u>, <u>learn the lesson</u>, and try to be more careful next time; some will go to <u>the police station</u> to ask for help from them is it's something very expensive. 3. Is it an effective way to use rewards to find lost things?

-It depends <u>how big the reward is</u>. If the reward is <u>tempting enough</u>(足够 诱惑人), that might encourage more people to join in and help find the <u>lost item</u>. If the reward is not big enough, people might just ignore it. So, sometimes it could work, but not always. <u>And also</u>, it depends on what the thing is. Sometime you don't need to use rewards at all if it's something special and meaningful. somewhere, and the teddy bear was the last gift from <u>her late mom</u>(已故 的母亲). And when she <u>asked for help</u> on the internet, the whole city was <u>on the mission of finding that teddy bear</u> for the girl. Eventually, the teddy bear was found and returned to her. So, rewards are good strategies but aren't always needed(奖励是很好的策略但是不是总是有必要

的).(分情况,补充,举例子)

4. What kinds of people may lose things often?

Kids lose things pretty often. They are <u>less experienced and responsible</u> in life, and that's why they're more <u>distracted and unmindful</u> about their things; and some adults are also very <u>forgetful</u>. Some of them <u>are born</u> <u>this way</u> (生来如此), and some of them just <u>couldn't be bothered</u> to <u>use</u> <u>their brain power</u> on remembering small things (有些人就是懒得运用脑力在记忆事情上); and what else, old people tend to be a little bit more <u>absent-minded</u>. It is because they're ageing, and they're losing abilities and skills, including their memory. (分群体)

(1)Is it easier for young people to change?

But I would say, <u>from what I can see</u>, old people around me, they <u>are more reluctant to(更抵触)</u> change compared with the young. And the logic behind this is very understandable. Making changes means <u>getting out of your comfort zone(跳出舒适圈)</u>, <u>be</u>

<u>vulnerable(</u>展示脆弱), and feeling unconfident. Older people have so much more life experience, they have their supportive families, established careers, and life routines. It takes much more energy and effort to change. <u>The resistance is higher(阻力更大)</u>. Sometimes I feel that old people are more <u>narrow-minded(思维狭窄) and stubborn(执拗)</u> <u>when it comes to</u> learning and accepting new things. They have fears and doubts. So yeh, it's normally not that easy for old people to change.(主流 情况,特殊情况)

(3) How can people change their daily routine if they want to?
First off, don't be ambitious. If it's a big change, they need to <u>take baby</u>
steps(迈小步子). Step by step, little by little. And then, the second thing
is to <u>follow the new routine</u> completely. No <u>back and forth</u>(不要来来回回)

变). <u>Stick to</u>(遵守) the new routine, <u>give it time</u>(加以时间), and then they will <u>form a new habit</u>. And once it becomes a habit, it will be easier. (罗列)

(4) What are the disadvantages when people keep making changes? There're always <u>pros and cons</u> when you do things. Making changes is <u>taking risks</u> (冒险), so obviously, there're <u>downsides</u> (缺点). First thing <u>comes to mind</u>, you will have <u>a feeling of losing control</u> (失去掌控的感觉). Like I said, making changes is jumping out of your comfort zone. It feels scary (感觉很恐怖). Some people like it, some people don't. <u>That sense of</u> <u>insecurity</u> could be <u>intimidating</u> (令人感到恐怖的) and nerve-racking (令人 神经紧绷的). And then, it's more work (要做的工作更多). Each time when you make a change, you need to adapt to the new way of doing things, and <u>get rid of</u> the old way. During this transition, you need to do more work than before. Sometimes it even looks like the new change is not working as you are doing more work. And next, when you take the risk, <u>there's always a chance of failing</u>. Not every change can lead to a <u>happy</u> <u>ending</u> (快乐结局). So, be aware of that, and be prepared. (罗列)

For them, <u>the more the merrier</u>(人越多越好,越多越开心). I've been to parties that had 100 people, and I've also been to <u>small gathering</u>s that only had a few people. They are all interesting, in different ways. Big parties are more exciting, and small gatherings are more relaxing and intimate. (分群体)

4. Do people often celebrate festivals with families?

Yes, I would say so. Traditional festivals, especially Spring Festival is just like Christmas. It's <u>family time</u>. <u>It's the time of the year</u> when families <u>gather together</u>, have nice meals, <u>catch up with each other</u>, just <u>spend</u> <u>family time together</u>. Of course, you can also see your friends during

festivals, but it's more for your family. (原因)

- 1. How do people express happiness in your culture? Just like most people in this world, Chinese will smile, laugh, <u>clap their</u> <u>hands</u>, <u>hug each other</u>, even dance a little when they are happy. And each individual might have their own unique way of <u>expressing</u> <u>happiness</u>. <u>Take my mom for example</u>, she loves cooking for us when she's <u>in a good mood</u>. She will be <u>humming songs</u> (哼着小曲) in the kitchen, and <u>with a big smile on her face</u>. You know she's happy when she does things like that. (列举, 举例子)
- 2. Do you think happiness has any effect on people? How? If a person is happy, it definitely <u>brings many good things to</u> this person. First, they will <u>have a less chance of getting diseases</u>, as good mood brings good health. And then, when people are happy, they are more willing to <u>apply themselves to a task</u>, so they <u>get more things</u> <u>done</u>, they are more <u>productive</u>. And also, everybody loves a happy person, so they will have more friends. So, yeh, absolutely happiness has several <u>positive "side effects"</u> (积极的 "副作用") on people. And When a person is <u>unhappy and depressed</u>, they are lonely, they are <u>more prone to illness</u> (更倾向于生病), they <u>can't get anything done</u>, they are <u>at a really bad place</u>. That's why everybody wants to be happy, nobody wants to be unhappy forever. (正向假设, 罗列, 反向假设)
- 3. How can people be happy?

-I read a book several years ago. It was about a study on why some people are happy. And I remember that the conclusion was something like: happiness is determined by several aspects in life, A, your job, B, your family (or your partner), C, your social life (your friends), and D, your lifestyle, something like that. So, basically, after reading that book, I <u>came to the conclusion that</u> if people want to be really happy, they need to, <u>have a career</u> that they like and feel proud of; <u>have a beautiful</u> <u>family</u>, and feel happy and <u>in love with their life partner</u>; have good friends to <u>share laughter and tears</u>, and <u>meet new people</u> every now and then; <u>live an interesting life</u> that they are happy with. (罗列) -Different people have different definitions on what happiness is. Their needs and expectations vary (期待和需求各不相同). For some people, happiness is being wealthy and successful. Having a lot of money makes them happy. For some people, they feel blissful when they are with their families. And for some people, their happiness is based on the things they like, nice food, beautiful art, wonderful music. They feel the happiest when they are doing things they like. So, really, <u>I don't</u> know the answer to this question. (分群体)

4. Is it good for people to be unhappy? Why?

I think the question should be, what should we do when we feel unhappy, as feeling unhappy in unavoidable, it's the norm(问题应该是,我们在不快乐的时候该做什么,因为不快乐是无法避免的,是常态的). Nobody can be happy forever, all the time. There're always ups and downs in life(生活中的起起伏伏). And all the downs help us realize how precious the good moments are in life. We need those bad days in order to cherish the good days. Just like, after I went camping in a tent in winter, after suffering from the cold weather, my warm and soft bed at home was like HEAVEN(正如我在冬天在帐篷里露营之后,我那温暖又柔软的床就成了天堂). We should learn to live with unhappiness(与不快乐共存), knowing that it will pass one day, nothing lasts forever. And let this unhappiness become the motivation for us to cheer up, and conquer the difficulties, and feel happy one day. (原因,举例子)

This is the tradition in my country. Before the <u>wedding ceremony(婚礼仪</u> <u>式)</u>, we have a little tradition called "Jie Qin"接亲. Basically the idea is, the groom will go to the bride's parents' home, <u>knock on the door</u>, with all the best men and also <u>loads of gifts</u>, and <u>pick up the bride</u>. But it's definitely <u>not an easy task</u>. People will <u>put on a show(演一出戏)</u>, the bride and bridesmaid will give the groom a hard time(给新郎难题,让他难 堪), pretending they don't want to leave, things like that.

So, as you can imagine, as <u>the maid of honour</u>, I was <u>giving my best</u> <u>performance (极力演出)</u>! I was <u>yelling and screaming like a freak (像疯子</u> <u>一样叫喊)</u>, giving the groom and his guys all kinds of tasks to test how much he wanted to marry my best friend. I was <u>setting up obstacles and</u> <u>hurdles like crazy (疯狂设立障碍)</u>. For example, asking the groom to <u>walk</u> <u>on his hands (倒立走路)</u>, or <u>put on lip colour (抹上口红)</u> and kiss all the best men on the face (涂上口红亲吻所有伴郎), that kind of things.

After that, at the dinner, I <u>made a wedding speech</u> in front of everyone, which was a little <u>overwhelming</u> for me, as I'd never <u>made a public</u> <u>speech</u> before that wedding. Therefore, I felt that I almost <u>passed out</u> during the speak. Maybe <u>I bit off more than what I could chew</u>, maybe.

Anyway, at the end of the day. I <u>could barely keep my eyes open</u> as I was totally <u>wiped out</u>. That was <u>an intense day</u> that I had. Thank you!

1. Are you often busy?

-Sometimes, not always. When I have <u>deadlines</u> or <u>final exams</u> coming up, I'll <u>burn the candle at both ends</u>, and just <u>be up to my neck</u> during that whole week. -Yes, I'm <u>all the time</u> being <u>hectic</u>. I always <u>have my hands full, juggling</u> <u>different things</u>. Right now, I have <u>three school projects(3 个学校项目课</u>

题) happening at the same time, and I'm also <u>preparing for a provincial</u>

<u>singing contest</u>(准备一个省级歌唱比赛), and <u>on top of everything</u>, I'm <u>part-</u>

<u>time working</u> at a café, twice per week. <u>I'm as busy as a beaver</u>. (细节)

-At the moment, I'm pretty chill for most of the time. I hate <u>being</u> <u>swamped with things</u>. I definitely <u>don't perform well under pressure</u>(我绝 对压力下发挥不好). And I don't like the feeling of <u>getting burned out</u>. That's why I left my previous job a year ago, and now <u>I'm taking my time to</u> <u>recover</u>. (原因)

2. What are the advantages and disadvantages when people keep busy?

I think, keep busy, but not too busy, could actually be a really good thing. Because, first, you <u>always have something to do</u>, so it's easier to <u>stay</u> <u>energetic and positive,</u> as you <u>have a goal to work towards</u>. You don't feel bored or <u>a sense of being directionless</u>. And then, it's nice to <u>get out of</u> <u>your comfort zone from time to time</u>(时不时的跳出舒适区是件好事), and <u>challenge yourself(挑战自己)</u> a little. it can help you grow and develop more. Meanwhile, talking about <u>negative effects</u>, well, like I mentioned, being TOO busy <u>is not a good thing</u> anymore. When you are <u>swamped</u> <u>with things</u>, and couldn't <u>take a breather</u>, that can <u>cause a lot of stress</u>. That's bad for both your <u>mental and physical health</u>. And also, when you're <u>completely overwhelmed with work</u>, the <u>quality of your work</u> will <u>go down</u>(你的工作质量会下降). When you lose <u>the balance between life</u> <u>and work</u>, you will end up becoming the opposite of being productive (这 会成为高产状态正相反的状态). And what's more, if you keep <u>being snowed</u> <u>under</u> like that, you will <u>get burned out</u> eventually. (对比罗列讨论)

补充表达: When you are busy and juggling several things at the same time, you need to be more organized, and you will improve your skills, like time management skills, problem solving skills, communication skills, things like that.

3. Do you think children should learn through playing games or under pressure?

<u>I choose playing games a thousand times</u>. Learning through playing is the most natural way to learn. When children are happy, they <u>naturally and</u> <u>voluntarily</u> remember more knowledge(自然地、自愿地学习知识). Some people may say that playing isn't learning, it's not serious enough. <u>But I</u> <u>say</u>, we need to see the difference between children and adults. We need to know <u>how they're wired (他们是如何被编程设置的,表示天生是什么样的)</u>. <u>Kids are wired/designed/programed</u> to play and learn at the same time (孩子天生就是学着玩,玩着学). Think about younger kids, toddlers(幼儿), they don't sit down and learn things, they all learn through playing games with their parents and teachers. But later, once we send our kids to primary school, we forget that they're still so young, and they are playful. (让位驳斥)

4. What kind of pressure people may experience at work?

There are different types of pressure, <u>in my opinion</u>. Pressure from work, from your clients, from your boss, and from your coworkers(同事). Pressure from work, like <u>long hours</u>(工作时长很长), <u>heavy workload</u>(工作 量很大), <u>lack of autonomy(缺乏自主权)</u>, tight schedules(行程紧), and <u>tight deadlines</u>(截止日期时间很紧), things like that. And second, if you have clients that are really <u>picky</u> and rude, and <u>impossible to please</u>, you'll <u>be under a lot of stress</u>. And then, if your boss is not supporting you enough, or he/she is doing the opposite, by being <u>untrusting(不信任)</u>, <u>unsupportive</u>(不支持), and <u>disrespectful</u>(不尊重的). You will feel even more <u>stressed out</u>. And then, if you are working in a <u>toxic environment</u> (有毒的环境)where the people around you are <u>resentful</u> to you, that just makes things even worse(雪上加霜).(分类讨论,罗列)

So, I went through a tough time right after I entered my university.

(背景故事) I was <u>in a "party mode"</u> every day (每天都是派对模式), and I didn't want to <u>put any effort into</u> my studies. I felt that I <u>had a burn-out</u> in high school when I was preparing for the <u>college entrance exam</u> (高考). So, in the first year in university, I didn't try at all, and then my <u>grades</u> <u>were terrible (分数都很糟糕)</u> in the second year. I <u>freaked out</u> (吓坏了), didn't know what to do. I felt very clueless (没有头绪) and helpless. Eventually, I <u>turned to (求助于)</u> my father for some advice.

My father is always like my <u>mentor</u>(导师), my <u>role model</u>(榜样), my best friend. When he heard about my situation, the first thing he did was to support me 100% mentally. He didn't <u>get harsh with me</u> at all, <u>quite the</u> <u>opposite</u>(正相反), he told me that he completely understood me. I was still just a kid, so of course I <u>got carried away</u>(得意忘形) when I got my freedom back.

He gave me <u>two pieces of advice</u>, first off, <u>keep my chin up</u> and try to <u>look</u> <u>up</u>. <u>Stay positive</u>. <u>The only way out is up</u>. That was what he said to me. And then second, <u>work harder</u>. He taught me <u>a bunch of very specific</u> <u>tactics</u> (一系列非常详细的具体策略). For example, always <u>prepare for the</u> <u>class beforehand</u> (提前准备课程). <u>Preview</u> (预习) every thing, even <u>take</u> <u>some notes</u>. And during class, <u>record the lecture</u> (录下整个课堂) with the permission from the professor, and later <u>review</u> (复习) everything again. Go to the library <u>on a daily basis</u>. Things like that. Finally, regarding how I felt about his advice and suggestions. I felt very warm and safe after that conversation. <u>As a matter of fact(事实上)</u>, I had already known what I needed to do before that conversation, but sometimes, you know, we just <u>need reassurance</u> from other people to validate our own feelings and thoughts (有的时候,你懂的,我们就是需要别人的安慰和确认去进一步证实自己的感受和想法), even if it's something very obvious(即便是很显而易见的事儿). That's the power of reassurance. I felt very grateful for the advice and very motivated for the future. It helped me <u>turn my life around</u>(扭转我的生活) and <u>keep going forward</u>(继续向 前).

So yeh, that was the story.

### Part3:

1. When should parents encourage their children?

Parents should encourage their children <u>all the time</u>, when children need the encouragement. I believe that daily activities <u>such as</u> eating, showering, reading, walking, cleaning, <u>can build confidence</u> for what children will face in the "real world" outside (外面的真实世界), like, team games, school things, conquering a difficulty. Therefore, if parents are constantly <u>instilling this confidence in children</u> (浇灌自信给孩子), they might <u>believe in themselves</u> more when they really need it one day. (举例 子, 正向假设)

2. Should parents always encourage their children?

<u>Having said that</u> parents should encourage their children all the time, however, <u>over-encouragement</u> could be a problem. That's why I said, parents should encourage children whenever THEY NEED the support, and <u>with the right amount of</u>(适量的) support. Too much support and too many compliments might <u>boost children's the self-esteem</u> so much to

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<u>the point that</u> they become ego-centric(太多支持和肯定可能会导致孩子自信心 爆棚而成为自视甚高者). Kids who grow up with too much <u>inflated</u> <u>encouragement</u>(过度膨胀,夸大其词的鼓励) could be really ignorant and fragile(脆弱) at the same time. (反向思考)

I don't think negative feedback is MORE important than positive feedback. I think they are EQUALLY important, because, without darkness there is no sunlight(没有黑夜就没有之后的阳光,完事都是两面的). I would say it could be a better approach(更好的做法) if we can give people negative feedback first and then encourage them with positive feedback(先给出负 面的反馈,再用正面的反馈去鼓励). (or the other way around also works, give positive feedback first, make people happy, and then get into the negative comments. 或者反过来也行,先给积极反馈,哄人开心,再给负面的评价). Both of them are important because positive feedback gives you confidence and courage(给你信心和鼓励), and negative feedback corrects you(纠正你),<u>keeps your head on straight</u>(让你保持头脑清醒), and helps you improve (进步). No matter how good you are, you ARE going to make mistakes in life(不管你多棒,都是会注定犯错), and if you want to continue getting positive feedback you must take the corrections from the negative ones. Also, only telling children or people positive fantasies (积极的幻想) about life will give them a false perception of reality(给他们 一个关于显示的错觉). There are negatives and positives in life, ups and

<u>downs, highs and lows</u>, and we must be prepared to handle that. (原因, 补充)

There're so many amazing and <u>life-changing(改变生活的)</u> inventions in the world <u>throughout the human history</u>(整个人类历史中). And the one I want to talk about today is: the internet.

It was invented in the 90s, in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. And ever since then, it has been bringing <u>accumulated knowledge</u>(累积的大量知识) and information to our fingertips(指尖). And it also has <u>changed the way we live</u> <u>dramatically.</u>

Talking about how it influences people of different ages, well, no matter what age you are, everybody loves and needs the internet. Some people, especially the young use it <u>for educational purposes</u>. <u>Easy internet access</u> means <u>easy access to</u> knowledge and information. "World Wide Web" allows education to <u>take place</u> anywhere and anytime. Students don't have to go to <u>physical classes</u> (实体班级) anymore, they can just <u>turn on</u>

<u>the computer, get online and learn like a sponge!</u> There're all kinds of online courses and free online information accessible. The cost of education has definitely been cut down <u>thanks to the internet</u>.

And then, some people use the internet for shopping. <u>E-commerce</u> is <u>a</u> <u>big deal</u> nowadays(电子商务是件大事儿). <u>Back in the old days(曾经的岁月</u> <u>里)</u>, people used to spend a lot of time going to different shops and stores, checking products, and making decisions on what to buy. Shopping was a decision that was <u>thought through</u>. But now, there're endless <u>sites</u>(网站) from where you can get information and buy the latest brands online. You just need <u>to browse and click(浏览和点击)</u>, and things will <u>be delivered to your door</u>! It's too easy. Therefore, <u>impulsive</u> <u>shopping</u>(冲动购物) is happening everywhere.(时间分层)

And what else, nowadays, no matter what age, people use the internet to <u>connect with one another(连接彼此)</u>. The internet <u>laid the foundation</u> <u>work for</u> another revolutionary invention, which is <u>social media</u>(自媒体). Social media indeed has changed our <u>personal space</u>, the way we interact with <u>our loved ones(我们的爱人)</u>, our friends and family, and even with strangers online. We <u>rely heavily on</u> the internet to <u>connect with people</u>, <u>communicate with each other</u>, and <u>network with new people</u>. <u>Face to</u> <u>face communication</u> is still important, but sometimes <u>it seems that</u> people prefer to <u>check in with each other</u>(关心、询问彼此)online in this <u>fast-paced modern time</u>. 1. What is the most helpful innovation at home?

-<u>The way I see it</u>, you cannot have a home without a TV. <u>Maybe this is just</u> <u>my personal opinion</u>, but I really think that the television is the best and most helpful invention in modern history. Almost everybody loves watching TV. It's relaxing and highly entertaining. ## 2. What household appliances make us lazy?

They are the kinds of inventions that <u>do things for us</u>, <u>free us from chores</u>(把我们从琐事中解放出来), but at the same time, when things are too easy for us, we become lazy. We don't want to do anything. (细节)

3. What kind of invention can be used at school?

Well, inventions that can be used at school include: computers, iPads, SMART boards, etc. My little nephew who is only 12 years old, is using an iPad to <u>take notes</u> and <u>do homework</u> already. I remember when I was little, we only had computers in the computer room. We learned everything from the blackboard, and wrote everything down <u>by hand</u>. It's a different world now(是不同的世界了).(举例子,时间分层)

## 4. Do you think AI will replace human teachers? Why?

I don't think AI will replace human teachers. Especially after the pandemic, I think people have seen the difficulties of <u>online learning</u> and not having that <u>face-to-face contact</u> and interaction with other students and teachers. <u>At least from what I can see</u>, many people were ready to get back to in-person-learning. While AI might be convenient and a fast way to learn, I don't believe it will ever replace human teachers, at least not fully. What's more, in fact, I think AI teaching and real teachers can work together <u>hand in hand (在一起携手工作)</u>, help each other out (互相帮助). For example, some IT companies are creating <u>custom textbooks</u> (量身定制 的课本) to address the different needs that students have, and helping teachers to <u>get rid of the one-size-fits-all method (摆脱千篇一律的教学模</u> <u>式)</u>. - I'm not a <u>tea artist</u>(品茶大师), I <u>prepare my tea</u> on a very casual level(很随意). I normally just brew my tea in a <u>big mug</u>(大水杯子).
- There are normally a <u>tray</u>(托盘), a <u>teapot(茶壶)</u>, and <u>a bunch of</u> <u>tea cups</u>(几个茶杯) in a <u>tea set</u>. / A tea set <u>consists of</u>...
- Some tea sets are more <u>complicated and exquisite</u>(更复杂精美), some are simpler. <u>The main idea</u> is more or less the same (主要概念是 大同小异的). Oh yeh!!! There's also a little clay figurine (小泥巴塑像), called <u>tea pet</u>(茶宠) in the tea set. It's just something cute to look at and also people believe it <u>brings good luck</u>. Like, the most popular <u>tea pet</u> is <u>an imaginary creature</u> in China called Piqiu, that looks like a mix between a dragon and a lion (看起来像是龙和狮子的混

合物). And it's<u>a symbol of wealth</u>.

- In order to fully enjoy a cup of tea, it needs to be properly made. And <u>Chinese tea sets</u> are <u>the best tools</u> for enhancing <u>the taste and</u> <u>the fragrance of tea.</u>
- A <u>professional tea set</u> is the perfect kind of gift for those who're truly <u>passionate about tea art</u>.
- The teapot for a professional set is usually rather expensive and is made of either <u>ceramics</u>(陶瓷做的) or <u>clay</u>(陶土). A whole tea set can go from 200yuan to 2000yuan or even more!
- 2. Chinese fans 中国扇:
  - hand fan/holding fan 手上拿的扇
  - folding fan 折扇 (foldable)
  - Chinese fans are exquisite and also practical! 美丽又实用
  - If you travel to China during the summer time, you can see people in the street <u>moving their arms</u> and <u>fanning away the striking heat</u> (摇动着胳膊,把炎热扇走! fan 有动词词性). They are beating the heat with their fans!

- When I was little, I remember that everyone had a hand fan in the summer time. When I took a nap, or went to bed at night, my mom would lie down with me together, and she would be <u>moving her</u> <u>arm</u> and <u>fan away the heat</u> for me, so that I could sleep better. So, even now, whenever I see a hand fan, <u>somehow</u> that still <u>reminds</u> <u>me of my mom</u>. It's just a very <u>fond memory</u> of my childhood.
- Chinese fans have been <u>noted for(被熟知)</u>their exquisite workmanship(手艺).
- Chinese hand fans are normally made of feathers, silk, or paper. They're very light and <u>easy to carry around</u>.
- They don't occupy any space as they're foldable, perfectly <u>fit in</u> your pockets, bags or anywhere.
- Traditional fans were mainly made of feathers, so they are also called <u>feather fans</u>(羽毛扇). They were mainly popular among <u>the</u>

rich and nobility (有钱人和贵族).

- 3. Chinse Jade  $\pm$ 
  - In China, jade is not just a type of stone, it is also the symbol of <u>kindness, wisdom, justice, beauty, durability and wealth</u>(善良、智 慧、公正、美丽、持久和财富的象征).
  - For some people, they love wearing jade because they believe that jade <u>possess healing powers</u>(具有修复能量的作用).
  - <u>Jade comes in three colours</u>(有三种颜色), green, white and purple. And green jade is the most popular type, also the best type.
  - Jade <u>is valued</u> not only as a beautiful piece of jewelry, but also as an essential symbol of local culture.

Jade necklaces, bracelets, earrings are all well-liked among Chinese women.

• I personally love jade accessories. I have several jade necklaces. One in white, one in purple, and two in green. I especially love wearing them in the summer time. Because they are gemstones, it feels very cool on the skin, which is really nice.
• My parents bought me those jade necklaces. Each time when I put them on, I will remember when they gave me the gift, and feel loved and appreciated. So, yeh, they definitely hold a lot of sentimental value.

## 4. Qipao 旗袍

- Qipao is a traditional <u>close-fitting garment</u>(修身的服饰)/dress that <u>originated in 1920s(起源于……)</u> in Shanghai.
- It quickly became a <u>fashion trend(时尚潮流)</u> that was adopted by <u>movie stars and young women in</u> China. The history of Qipao <u>reflects</u> <u>the rise of the modern Chinese woman</u> in the 20<sup>th</sup> century(旗袍的历史 反映了中国女性在上世纪的地位上升).
- Young intellectual women <u>fought against</u>(对抗) <u>traditional customs</u> (传统习俗), such as <u>foot binding</u>(裏小脚), by showing off their bodies and curves(炫耀自己的身材和曲线).
- At that time, <u>traditional gender roles</u> were <u>being questioned and</u> <u>challenged</u>(传统的性别角色职责被收到了质疑和挑战), and women wanted to go to school, have careers, drive cars, <u>have more voices</u>(有 更多的声音), things like that.
- A qipao is normally <u>made from embroidered silk</u>(刺绣绸缎), <u>featuring</u> (以……为特色) a <u>high collar</u>(高领) and <u>delicate buttons</u>(精致的纽 扣) on the front.

(embroidered 刺绣的,这个词很高阶,记住最好,记不住就说 silk)

A Qipao can perfectly <u>accentuate a woman's curves</u>(强化女性的曲线 美). It's <u>a celebration of beauty and freedom</u>(是对于美和自由的庆祝).

Finally, to answer the question of how I feel about this product, well, I'm not a <u>tea artist</u>(品茶大师), I <u>prepare my tea</u> on a very casual level</u>(很随意的水平). I normally just <u>brew my tea</u> in a <u>big mug</u>(大水杯子). But having a tea set at home is a very common thing. They're very beautiful to look at, and they're are <u>the best tools</u> for enhancing <u>the taste and the fragrance</u> of tea. So, I think <u>it's a good investment</u> for the home (是值得买的家居小投资).

(流行的). Older generation enjoy something less intense, for example,

3. How can parents help and guide their kids to keep healthy? First off, parents should teach the importance of keeping healthy to their kids. Tell them the importance of <u>having a health diet</u>, encourage them to exercise <u>on a regular basis</u>, things like that. There are some children's books talking about health and hygiene. Parents can read to their kids, and guide them to <u>keep fit</u>. Or, watch some related cartoons together, and learn the ideas through watching TV. The format is not important, as long as kids can get the information. And then, parents are the <u>role</u> <u>models (榜样)</u> to their kids, doing the same thing, <u>setting the good</u>

<u>example(以身作则)</u> is key. Kids copy everything their parents do. You can't expect a kid to eat healthy vegetables when his/her parents only eat junk food every day. (罗列,举例子)

4. Do you think it is a good way for governments to use the power of idol to help people build health awareness?

I think so. We are now living in a society with an "idol culture". Young people praise their idols. They worship everything they do. Idols nowadays have incredibly powerful influence over their fans. And if we

can utilize this influence wisely to achieve something really positive, we shouldn't be too reluctant to do it. Some people may say that those idols who try to help the public <u>build health awareness</u> are all <u>money-oriented</u>

(以钱为本). They just want to make money. But why should we care about the true motivation behind these super stars' behaviour? As long as their words can <u>touch some people's hearts</u>, and help them <u>raise the</u> awareness, its what governments want. (让位驳斥)

- NBA games (basketball 美国国家篮球协会) Intense game, <u>your eyes</u> <u>are always moving around following the ball</u>. <u>Lots of betting</u> in this sport (很多赌球). Many famous people go to the games and <u>sit</u> <u>courtside</u> (坐在场边) and <u>steal a lof of thunder</u> (抢尽风头).

- Superbowl (American football 美式足球) Popular because of <u>the</u> <u>halftime show</u>(中场表演) that always features a great artist(中场表 演总是请来很棒的艺术家嘉宾表演) and a whole performance. Also because of the advertisements <u>in between the game</u>. Some people say the best part of the Superbowl is the ads.
- Reality competition shows (真人秀竞赛节目):
   Survivor, the Great British Bake Off (cooking competiton show),
   American's Next Top Model (美国超模 super model competition show), Britain's got talent (英国好声音)...
- 2. Why are competition shows popular? I think, it is because the people who go on the show are nobody (谁也 不是), just like us, we feel really close to them. And, wait till they're seen, heard, or found, they go from nobody to somebody overnight (一夜之间从谁也不是变成了家喻户晓的明星). We all have dreamed of what <u>it might be like</u> to be super stars(我们都梦想过成名是怎么样的). Competitions shows like this can open doors for no-names(给无名小卒 一扇门,一个机会), ordinary people who have dreams and talents. So, when we watch this kind of shows, we get to imagine ourselves on stage as well. We love seeing these "dreams come true" moments. And on top of that, it's highly entertaining to watch. Sometimes the judges' reactions are the most interesting part. I love seeing their dramatic facial expressions (夸张的面部表情). Like, the jaw just dropped, and then, they would stand up, clapping and smiling, with <u>tears in the eyes,</u> it's just really emotional and entertaining. (罗列原 因)

market by big companies. That's the sad truth to face. (反向思考)

Instead of feeling motivated to work harder and be creative, employees will spend most of their time worrying about getting laid off (被解雇), <u>losing their bonuses</u> (丢掉奖金), or <u>being looked down upon</u> (被看不起). When all they can think of is how to <u>survive</u> in the workplace, they will never <u>thrive</u> at work (survive 和 thrive 是一组押韵 梗。Survive 表示求生, thrive 表示大放光彩). (反向思考)

1. Why is it more difficult for children to concentrate nowadays than in the past?

Because there're too many distractions. And those distractions are mainly coming from the internet. <u>Generation Z</u> is a group of young people that are marked by the internet. <u>It's part of their DNA</u>. The internet breaks into their homes, their education and their way of making friends and socializing. Children nowadays <u>have access to</u> all information <u>at their</u> finger tips(手指点点就能获得信息). They like to get everything they want immediately. That's why their <u>attention span</u> is becoming very limited 他 们的注意力周期正变得越来越短. Not like children in the past, they didn't have too much to do. <u>Gen X and Y grew up in a much simpler world. They had less things and better concentration.</u> (时间对比)

2. Do you think technology will harm children's ability to concentrate?

I think technology has already <u>decreased the concentration</u> of kids. So, yeh, in the future, technology will continue <u>bringing a</u> <u>negative impact on children's concentration</u>. ## 1. What can people do to save time?

4. Do people who can manage time well become successful more easily?

I want to say yes. People who can manage time well tend to <u>have a higher</u> <u>chance of becoming successful in their own field</u>, <u>whatever that means</u>. I

mean, people have difference definitions of "being successful". For me, you don't have to be super wealthy or famous to be called successful. As long as you <u>feel powerful</u> and <u>(feel)</u> <u>in control</u> in life, you feel happy with who you are and how your life is, you ARE successful. People who have good time management kills can <u>manage their time more wisely</u>, they're able to meet deadlines(能遵守截止日期) and <u>avoid last-minute surprises</u>
