3. fy\ify purify/simplify/clarify

nullify v. 宣布...在法律上无效,使无效;使无价值

- to officially state that something has no legal force
- to make something lose its effect or value

justify v.

- to give an acceptable explanation for something that other people think is unreasonable
- to be a good and acceptable reason for something No argument can justify a war.

- to say or write bad things about someone or something vilify sb / sth for (doing) sth

amplify v.

- to make sound louder, especially musical sound
- to increase the effects or strength of something
- to explain something that you have said by giving more information about it

finish/accomplish/vanish

abolish v. 废除, 取消

 to officially end a law, system etc, especially one that has existed for a long time

Slavery was abolished in the US in the 19th century.

relinquish v.

- He relinquished control of the company: renounce, give up/away, hand over, let go of
- She relinquished her post: leave, resign from
- · He relinquished his pipe-smoking: discontinue, stop, cease, give
- She relinquished her grip: let go of, release, loose, loosen, relax.

delinquent adj. (通常指青少年)常有违法行为的, 屡犯轻罪的





4. ish admonish v. 责备;告诫;警告

• He was severely admonished by his father. (reprimand, rebuke, scold, reprove, reproach, chide)

• She admonished him to drink less. (advise, counsel, urge, exhort, enjoin)

diminish v. (使)减少, (使)减小, 削弱, 贬低

- to become or make something become smaller or less
- to deliberately make someone or something appear less important or valuable than they really are

Don't let him diminish your achievements. (belittle, disparage, denigrate, defame, depreciate)
