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

What causes man to think and behave in the way they do has been a question debated among the wisest philosophers since ancient Greece. **[backdrop]** Today, it has been commonly argued that most of us are largely defined by our surroundings, especially social groups of all kinds, and for this reason I choose to agree with this given statement. **[position]** (58 words)

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## 中间段 The Body Paragraph

Let's first talk about how political groups define who we are. More often than not, we form a certain set of political values and have our ideology fully shaped only after we come to identify with a particular political group we have had contact with through, for example, their political campaign. [reason] In the United States, for instance, there are blue states and red states. In those blue states in particular, residents might be inclined to advocate policies designed to reduce man's carbon footprint on this planet, or those aimed to implement a broadband healthcare plan. [example] It is not that those residents consciously choose to act the way they do; rather, they are subconsciously following their intuition or guts whenever they are actually making a decision. This is all because they are raised to support democrats, the very group they and their forefathers have strongly identified with. In this sense, a social group does have a say in our thought patterns. [explain the example] (160 words)
