To evaluate this argument, we first need to know whether the way the islanders of Tertia raise children has remained unchanged since twenty years ago. [evidence]



## 中间段 The Body Paragraph

To evaluate this argument, we first need to know whether the way the islanders of Tertia raise children has remained unchanged since twenty years ago. [evidence] If there is evidence that Tertia has changed significantly since Dr. Filed conducted his observational study, then Dr. Karp's conclusion is clearly weakened. [why] For example, Westerners might have settled on the island in the intervening years, and they have introduced a more typical western-style family structure. **Moreover,** it could have been that the visiting anthropologists, Dr. Field included, offered to encourage village of Tertia to abandon its child-rearing tradition--which is obviously not conducive to healthy childhood development for a lack of parental love--and to have the parents raise their own children instead. [counterexamples] Were these scenarios true, then Dr. Karp conclusions about Dr. Field's research would be highly unpersuasive. [summary] (135 words)



#### 官方范文

The first piece of <u>evidence</u> that we would need in order to evaluate Dr. Karp's claims is information about whether or not Tertia and the surrounding island group have changed significantly in the past 20 years. [summary] Dr. Field conducted his observational study 20 years ago, and it is possible that Tertia has changed significantly since then. [why] For example if we had evidence that in teh intervening years Westerners had settled on the island and they introduced a more typical western-style family structure, it would certainly weaken Dr. Karp's argument. [counterexample] In that case, the original study could have been accurate, and Dr. Karp's study could be correct, as well, though his conclusion that Dr. Field's method is ineffective would be seriously weakened. [summary] (121 words)

## 开头段 The Introductory Paragraph

#### Argument No. 4

It might seem logical, at first glance, to agree with the argument in Dr. Karp's article that children in Tertia actually are raised by their biological parents (and perhaps even, by implication, that an observation-centered approach to anthropological study is not as valid as an interview-centered one). [briefly summarize the argument] However, in order to fully evaluate this argument, we need to have a significant amount of additional evidence. The argument could end up being much weaker than it seems, or it might actually be quite valid. In order to make that determination, we need to know more then analyze what we learn. [challenge the argument] (99 words).
